



Lent begins on **Ash Wednesday, which is on February 14th this year.** The season of Lent lasts 40 days (not including Sundays), which represents the 40 days Jesus spent fasting in the wilderness. The imposition of ashes is often a central part of Ash Wednesday worship. Ashes have a long history in biblical and church traditions. In scripture, ashes or dust symbolize frailty or death (Gen. 18:27), sadness or mourning (Esther 4:3), judgment (Lam. 3:16), and repentance (Jonah. 3:6). Some traditions also have considered ash to be a purifying or cleansing agent. All these images are caught up in the church's use of ashes as a symbol appropriate for the beginning of Lent. In Christ's passion, we see God's judgment on evil. In our penitence, we express sorrow and repentance for our sins. In our rededication, we show that we are purified and renewed. The ashes we use at St. Mary's on Ash Wednesday are made by burning previous years' palms from Palm Sunday. Worshippers at the Ash Wednesday liturgy are invited to come forward to have the clergy make the sign of the cross on his or her forehead, saying:

*“Remember that you are dust
and to dust you shall return.”*

Ash Wednesday is one of only two fast days for all Episcopalians on the church calendar, and the Prayer Book calls it a Day of Obligation for the faithful to make a proper beginning of Lent by attending an Ash Wednesday liturgy. The following liturgies including the Imposition of Ashes and celebration of the Holy Eucharist on **Wednesday, February 14th** are available to all:

7:00am - St. Mary's Church (in the All Saints' Chapel)

12:00pm - St. Augustine's Episcopal Church (707 E. Lenoir Ave., Kinston)

7:00pm - St. Mary's Church (in the Church & livestreamed)

Come and See: An Invitation to Lent

Recently on a Sunday morning in our liturgies, we read together from John's Gospel and were reminded that "come and see" is the Christian invitation par excellence. God "came and saw" His creation when Jesus was born and He lived right here among us. God, of course, continues to be present with us through the Holy Spirit. Jesus invites us to "come and see" for ourselves how He is transforming lives, reconciling us and the rest of creation to God the Father. We, also, are called to invite others to "come and see" the amazing work and grace of God where He has promised to be and where we have experienced Him.

Far from a *dreary* season, the true heart of Lent is, quite simply, to draw close to God - to come near - with our true and honest selves with an openness to being transformed by His mercy and grace. And in so doing, we will see clearly God's love for us that transcends any brokenness that we experience. I invite you, therefore, to come and see for yourself everything that God has for you at St. Mary's this Lent. Every time the church doors are open - for worship, for fellowship, for learning - there is blessing for you to receive and to share. And invite others to come and see with you, for what better

invitation can we offer?

YOU MAY NOTICE...

The church calendar helps us mark time and make spiritual preparations for significant times in our lives of faith. Lent is our time of preparation for the celebration of Christ's victory over death and the season of Easter. In anticipation of the Easter season of exuberance and feasting, Christians in the Anglican tradition observe Lent by "self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word." Elements of our liturgies change during the season as well. Some things you may notice include our services beginning with "A Penitential Order," fewer candles, the more solemn purple color of vestments and paraments, our restraint from saying "Alleluia," and singing the "Kyrie Eleison" rather than the more festive "Gloria."



Let us pray:


