### **PALM SUNDAY**

Palm Sunday, March 24, begins with the Holy Eucharist Rite 1 at 8am. Breakfast will be served in Moseley Hall at 9am, and throughout the morning, palm crosses will be made. At 10:30, we'll gather outdoors near the playground for the Liturgy of the Palms and a procession into the church that recalls Jesus' entry into Jerusalem before his Passion. In the event of inclement weather, we will begin our procession in Moseley Hall.

### MONDAY AND TUESDAY IN HOLY WEEK

There will be liturgies offered on Monday, March 25 at 5:30pm and Tuesday, March 26 at 6:30pm. On Monday, our worship will be a "Teaching Eucharist" during which there will be instruction about the different parts of our Eucharistic liturgies. This service will be in the Nave. Tuesday's liturgy will be held in the All Saints' Chapel.

### WEDNESDAY IN HOLY WEEK

On Wednesday, March 27, we will begin with a community meal at 6:30pm followed by a service of Tenebrae (Latin for 'Darkness' or "Shadows'). At 7:30pm. Tenebrae features music from Taize & readings from the Psalms and other passages that foretell Jesus' Passion. This beautiful service, held in the Nave, offers a meditation upon, and a prelude to, the events of our Lord's life between the Last Supper and His Resurrection.

## THE PASCHAL TRIDUUM

(Maundy Thursday - Easter Sunday)

### **MAUNDY THURSDAY**

On Thursday, March 28, at 7:30pm, our Maundy Thursday liturgy held in the Nave will recall the institution of the Last Supper and Jesus' humble act of washing His disciples' feet. It ends with the stripping of the altar and the beginning of a vigil throughout the night in the Chapel. Join us for a special time of prayer and meditation, inspired by the question asked of all of us by Jesus - "Could you not watch with me one hour?" The Chapel prayer vigil begins at the conclusion of the Maundy Thursday liturgy and ends with communion at the Good Friday liturgy. All are invited to sign up for a 1-hour time slot during the vigil on the door to the Chapel.

### **GOOD FRIDAY**

This service in the Nave, on Friday, March 29, at noon, includes a homily, Solemn Collects, Veneration of the Cross, and Communion from the Reserved Sacrament. The Way of the Cross (Stations) will also be offered in the Nave at 5:45pm, ending the Good Friday observance.

### THE GREAT VIGIL OF EASTER


Taking place in the Nave, the Lenten observance officially ends and Easter celebration begins on **Saturday evening at 7:30pm** with this liturgy, one of the most ancient and exciting of the Christian Church - the celebration of the transition from the darkness of Holy Saturday into the light of Christ's Easter Victory. The liturgy lasts about an hour. It begins with the lighting of the New Fire at the entrance to the church and includes hymns & spiritual songs, accompanied by City Lights Jazz, renewal of baptismal vows, and the first Eucharist of Easter!

### **EASTER DAY**

On **Sunday, March 31**, the Feast of the Resurrection of our Lord will begin with the Holy Eucharist in the Chapel at 8am. The 10:30am service is a Festal Holy Eucharist with full choir, flowering of the cross, and all the glory of Easter Morning! There is also an Easter Egg Hunt for children following the service, so be sure to bring their Easter baskets!

## From the Rector

# AN INVITATION TO THIS HOLY TIME A season of reflection.



Let us come together and renew our faith as we journey through the Lenten season. Ash Wednesday begins the season of Lent. For Christians around the world, and throughout millennia, this time of preparation for Holy Week and Easter brings opportunity for renewal and deepening of life whenever the season's practices are approached as offerings and gifts of devotion to God. I pray that this season has been a blessing you thus far. And, even though it has already begun, it is never too late to offer to God your time, energy, or any other gifts. In particular, there are many areas of devotion to which the Church invites our renewed attention in Lent: selfexamination and repentance; prayer, fasting, and selfdenial; reading and meditating on God's holy Word. It is, of course, a matter of each individual's personal piety and sense of call that drives that person's approach to the observance of a "Holy Lent."

I'm writing to invite you, fully, into the most important time of the church year: Holy Week. There is no doubt in my mind that the Lord's Good News for your life will reach you whenever you accept the invitation to join in offering your life and presence in worship with the community of the faithful - praise God! So, if you come to Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday only, and that will be a categorically GOOD thing. But my hope for you also is that you will take this year's entire Holy Week (see page 1) as an opportunity to walk closely with Jesus, day by day through worship, song, prayer, teaching, humble acts of service, and unique acts of devotion, to appreciate the power of Jesus' resurrection in many ways. Each movement along this Holy Week journey offers a distinct perspective on God's love for you and all of creation. Our observance of the Great Vigil of Easter on Saturday, March 30 at 7:30pm, with music by our choir and the City Lights Jazz ensemble will be very special indeed! The Easter Vigil is the pinnacle liturgy of the Prayer Book. It concludes the 3-day Holy Triduum service (beginning with Maundy Thursday and including Good Friday) and ushers Easter joy and Christian hope in beautiful and special ways. I pray that you will dive, fully, into this sacred time. May the grace of God's endless love for you, and the joy of Jesus' resurrection, fill your heart this season and always.

### **Rector Discretionary Funds**

What are "Rector Discretionary Funds?" How are they collected? For what are they used?

On the second Sunday of each month, you may have noticed in the bulletin or the weekly email an announcement stating the "loose plate offering will go towards the Rector Discretionary Funds." But what exactly does that mean? These funds allow your clergy to respond in a timely manner to needs that arise within and outside the St. Mary's community. Here are just a few of the needs and ministries that St. Mary's has been able to respond to in recent months: utility, grocery, medical, and short-term lodging assistance for individuals in crisis within Lenoir County; scholarship assistance for youth camps and activities as well as adult participation in Education for Ministry; SAFE in Lenoir County; the American Friends of the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem; and the Episcopal Farmworker Ministry. The ability to use the Rector Discretionary Funds in these ways are an active, tangible, Christian response to an individual or community need. May God bless you and your giving!

Sometimes called the Stations of the Cross, this short devotional experience, usually about 20 minutes, is both tactile and meditative. As we move to each of the fourteen markers throughout the church, a different event of Jesus' Passion is remembered. Please consider making a commitment to walk the Way of the Cross at least once this Lent.
