

# From the Rector

Dear. St. Mary's Parish Family,

I want to tell you about something that happened to me recently that I found interesting. I was typing away on my computer one day. What I was writing had something to do with the Opening Day of the Major League Baseball season (which was on Maundy Thursday... and began with a win for my Baltimore Orioles!). Then something crazy happened: I misspelled a word. While it's actually not that unusual for me to misspell words (I hope I haven't misspelled any in this article!), the interesting thing about this was *how* I misspelled a word. I



intended to write "Major" - like "Major League" - only instead of typing m-a-j-o-r, my fingers automatically hammered out m-a-j-o-y... which isn't even a word!

But what I think happened in that moment is an example of one of the countless ways that I have been molded into the person that I am by serving as the rector of St. Mary's. Serving at St. Mary's, where our motto is to "serve with JOY," means that we also talk about joy and (apparently) write about joy quite a lot! Typing that word over and over and over again has made it so that I automatically leaned into writing it again, without even thinking about it. Kind of like how the players on the Major League Baseball teams - or perhaps your college basketball team of choice - practice over and over again doing what they want to do well in their games, SO THAT when the moment comes they will automatically do that good thing without even thinking about it.

Practice matters. Repetition matters. Because when we do something often, it will change us. Jesus gives us things to practice in order to be shaped more and more into what God would have us be. The church invites us into these practices too. I hope that the season of Lent was a helpful example of that for you. On Maundy Thursday, we recalled the new *mandate* of Jesus: to love one another as Jesus loves. While no one can ever love perfectly like Jesus loves, it certainly is what we're called to strive towards, and thankfully, by God's grace, it is what we're all invited to receive. May this Easter season be filled with moments of practicing, both giving and receiving love in the Spirit of Jesus. 


