From the Rector

"Do not think that love, in order to be genuine, has to be extraordinary. What we need is to love without getting tired. How does a lamp burn? Through the continuous input of small drops of oil. If the drops of oil run out, the light of the lamp will cease, and the bridegroom will say, "I do not know you" (Matt. 25:12). What are these drops of oil in our lamps? They are the small things of daily life: faithfulness, small words of kindness, a thought for others, our way of being silent, of looking, of speaking, and of acting. These are the true drops of love that keep your religious life burning like a living flame."

~ Mother Teresa of Calcutta

Here at St. Mary's, we frequently speak of our common life together as the Life of Faith. This is not to be understood as our "Sunday morning" life or our "Bible study" life or our "Prayer group" life. The Life of Faith is the whole, entire life of the person of faith. This, of course, entails those times when we gather together on the Lord's Day for common prayer & worship, and the other times when we do "church-y" things! But, understood more fully, the Life of Faith is meant to encompasses everything that our lives hold - to the most ordinary or mundane details. God is there as well!

I love how Mother Teresa put it in the quotation above. Truthfully, the ordinary and usual aspects of our everyday living must become those drops of oil in our lamps such that our lives burn brightly, not only for God, but indeed with God's spiritual light for this world.

In the month of May, as we continue the season of Easter, consider afresh the practices or habits that are life-giving drops of oil for you. Maybe they are things that you learned from a Lenten season in the past that you sense God calling you to continue. Maybe they will be something completely new, and you aren't sure how they'll work out. Maybe there are things in this Bell Ringer to which you are called to engage or support. Maybe there is a practice for you that is as simple (but as challenging) as slowing down from a quite busy pace and more intentionally appreciating the people and God-given life around you. May you be delighted by joy and life all around you in this Easter season!

Bishop Skirving Visits St. Mary's

On Sunday, May 18, 2025, we are excited to have a baptism, confirmations, and receptions planned for the 10:30am liturgy. This day also will be significant in our parish life with the visit of

Bishop Skirving. Given the number of worshiping communities in the Diocese of East Carolina, Bishop Skirving is present with each one on a Sunday about once every two years.





Baptism is full initiation by water and the Holy Spirit into Christ's Body, the church. God establishes an indissoluble bond with each person in baptism. God adopts us, making us members of the church and inheritors of the Kingdom of God (BCP, pp. 298, 858). In baptism we are made sharers in the new life of the Holy Spirit and the forgiveness of sins.

Confirmation, Reception, and Reaffirmation are rooted in the baptismal covenant. Confirmation/Reception/Reaffirmation are sacramental rites in which the candidates "express a mature commitment to Christ, and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through prayer and the laying on of hands by a bishop" (BCP, p. 860).

Bishop Skirving will be our celebrant and preacher this day, and we will renew our baptismal vows at both 8am and 10:30am liturgies. This will be an absolutely joyful day in the life of St. Mary's Church! Invite a friend to join you!






Wednesday Night Dinner & Program

What joy it will be to participate in the start of this new season of blessings for the children of this community!




Ascension Day is 40 Days after Easter (May 29, 2025) Enjoy this snippet from The Little Way Chapel's May Guide for Families, and pick up a copy at church!

FAMILY HUDDLE

For forty days after Jesus' resurrection, he walked, talked, and ate with his disciples, teaching them about the kingdom of God before ascending to the Father. Ascension Day serves as a reminder for us that, in the words of Teresa of Avila, "Christ has no body but yours, no hands, no feet on earth but yours...Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands, with which he blesses all the world." We are his body and must live into and up to this holy vocation. From the very earliest observances of this feast day, the liturgical procession led outside the city often up a hill to imitate Christ leading the disciples outside of Bethany before ascending (Lk 24:50). To celebrate the Ascension, take your family on a hike up a mountain or hill. During your family's procession discuss how you can be Jesus' hands and feet in the world. Conclude by praying together:

Grant, we pray, Almighty God, that as we believe your only-begotten Son our Lord Jesus Christ to have ascended into heaven, so we may also in heart and mind there ascend, and with him continually dwell; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen. - Book of Common Prayer
