

Recently, I had the joy and privilege of sharing a time of conversation and prayer at Mary's Kitchen as four original stained glass windows were installed in the dining room. These works, designed by Renée Herlong and crafted by Bonnie & Seraphim Smith, instantly bring light, color, and beauty to a space already permeated with the Holy Spirit that has inspired nearly 4 decades of loving service. As one enters Mary's Kitchen, the first 3 images depict the beauty of God's Creation on a westward journey across North Carolina from the sandy beaches, to the piedmont, and finally to the mountains. They are stunning in their reflection of the natural beauty that God has given to this area. And as much as I love the first three, it was the story of the fourth window, placed closest to the serving counter, that resonated in my soul the most. This window is made of a variety of pieces of glass drawn from the 'scrap pile' in the studio. It reminds me of the grace-filled character of God that is shown repeatedly throughout Scripture and that tells us no matter what our various challenges, imperfections, shortcomings, or faults may be, God's love for us is constant and God's will for us is to be made new and whole, in a beautiful design of God's making. And like these new windows in Mary's Kitchen, God's redeeming work in our lives is meant to bring joy and beauty to the lives of others. May we all look for this work in our own lives today. And as we do, I invite you to consider coming over to serve at Mary's Kitchen sometime to see these new windows in person!


