PENTECOST SUNDAY June 8, 2025

"And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak with other tongues, as the spirit gave them utterance."

[Acts 2:1-4]

Pentecost is a Principle Feast Day of the church calendar, celebrated on the seventh Sunday after Easter. This year, **Pentecost is June 8th**. While there is an ancient Jewish holiday of the same name, for Christians, Pentecost commemorates the gift of the Holy Spirit to the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem observing the Jewish custom. Because the Holy Spirit has inspired the spread of the Good News of Jesus to the world, Pentecost is often understood to be the birthday of the Church. Happy Birthday!!! On this day, the clergy wear **RED** vestments, and the altar will be adorned with red hangings. It is even customary for the people of the congregation to wear **RED** as well.

In addition to celebrating Pentecost on June 8, we will honor our graduates as well. See page 7 for more details.

From the Rector

SERVE with JOY, RISE with JOY!



Greetings, friends! The seasons are changing and we recently have concluded our 2024-2025 Program Year at St. Mary's. This edition of the BellRinger acknowledges with great thanks MANY of the people who "served with joy" to help make this a wonderful year. There truly

has been a lot to celebrate of late, especially with Bishop Skirving's recent visit to St. Mary's and 32 people being baptized, confirmed, received, or reaffirming their baptismal vows over the last 2 Sundays of May. Another highlight for the end of the Program Year was our last Wednesday Night Supper and the presentation/update of our Long Range Planning projects. It was a great time to reflect on what has happened, what's going on now, and our next steps. Personally, it was wonderful for me to prepare the slides because it was the first time that I had intentionally gone back to review "before and after" pictures of the work that has taken place since last March's launch of the RISE with JOY Capital Campaign. The energy in the room during the presentation was marked with thanksgiving for the prayerful discernment that was the foundation of all of this work, and for the skill and intentionality with which the work has been carried out. I hope you'll take some time to look at the presentation and ask any questions that come to mind to members of the Long Range Planning Committee, Vestry, or me. Above all, please hold these projects and all in involved in your prayers. Of course, all of our work in service to God is related to the inner work that God is seeking to do within us. Many scriptures point to this, but one that comes to mind is 2 Corinthians 5:17 when St. Paul writes "if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come." As a person comes to faith in Jesus and grows in spiritual maturity, change unfolds not only within the person, but that inner life of faith "bears fruit" that is visible to the outside world. Sometimes that change is welcome and sometimes it is harder to accept. Sometimes you feel very much like a "work in progress" and wonder if it is worth it or how it is going to work out. I wonder what you would find if you took some time in this new summer season to ask God to remind you of the work that He is doing in you. What is the "before and after" of God's work in you that you could notice today? I'd be glad to talk and pray with you through these questions if you'd like. And, as we remember that Jesus is the author and finisher of our faith (Hebrews 12:2), may we all ask how God's Holy Spirit is leading us to serve with JOY in this season of our life of faith. Music Notes

As summer approaches, I want to express my deep appreciation and gratitude for the dedicated members of the handbell and chancel choirs who give their time and talents in their ministry of music at St. Mary's. It is both a privilege and joy to work with such a committed and loyal group of people!

One of the most beautiful and ancient traditions of our Anglican tradition is Choral Evensong, sung as the sunlight begins to fade in the evening. Based on the Evening Prayer service in the Book of Common Prayer, Evensong is a beautiful, prayerful service of music and scriptures. In the Narthex, you will find a reprint of an article from a 2004 edition of the Anglican Digest that presents an informative discussion by Jeff McConnaughy of the different elements of choral Evensong. Please feel free to take one, and learn more about this ancient tradition. When I am preparing music for this beautiful service, I often refer to this article.

We have sung Evensong several times this year, but beginning in the fall, we will offer Choral Evensong the second Sunday of each month, beginning in September and going through May (with the exception of December and January). This service will become a St. Mary's tradition and a beautiful offering to the community. Please invite your friends and neighbors! On June 15th, 2025 at 5:30pm, Schola Cantorum of the Diocese of East Carolina will offer Choral Evensong at St. Mary's. This beautiful service is especially important and an event you don't want to miss because the full choir of approximately seventy voices will present the music they will sing during their upcoming tour of cathedrals in England and Scotland. A reception will follow in Mosely Hall.

Then, on July 20th, 2025 at 4pm, all are invited to join us in the sanctuary or a "Midsummer afternoon Hymn Sing." We will spend an hour singing hymns of your choice. Feel free to choose hymns from The Hymnal 1982, Wonder Love & Praise, and Lift Every Voice & Sing. St. Barnabas Church: Community Service

Stained Glass Window Restoration Campaign

Please join us for our upcoming St. Barnabas community service on Saturday, June 21 at 10:00 am!! In case you haven't been to a service before, St. Barnabas is located as St. (Spow Hill NC)

at 1 St. Barnabas St. (Snow Hill, NC).

The Rev. Tom Warren, Rector of St. Mary's Episcopal Church in Kinston, will officiate the service and deliver the sermon. We will use the 1928 Book of Common Prayer which includes poetic language largely unchanged from its 1552 English counterpart.

St. Barnabas was designated an historic site in 1979. It is listed in the U.S. Department of Interior's Registry of National Historic Places and is featured by the Snow Hill Historic Preservation Commission in its tour of historic places. 2025 is the 141st year since the setting of St. Barnabas' cornerstone in 1884. The church was established as a mission of the Diocese of East Carolina several years earlier. The Rt. Rev. Alfred Augustine Watson, DD, First Bishop of the Diocese, consecrated the building in 1893.



We are pleased to share we are continuing our campaign to restore the wonderful stained glass windows of St. Barnabas!
