



The Glenn & Nelda Potter Fund

Glenn & Nelda Potter were very active, beloved members of St. Mary's for decades. Their lives and ministries blessed this community in countless ways. After theirs deaths, they chose to offer yet another gift as they remembered St. Mary's Church in their wills with a no-strings-attached financial gift.

The Vestry has chosen to use their gift to establish the Glenn & Nelda Potter Fund. A small percentage of the fund will be made available each year, protecting the fund's principal. While the Vestry will have full discretion to use the income of the fund for the purposes deemed most appropriate at the time, the following will be the fund's usual uses: (i) any needs relating to the Boar's Head & Yule Log Festival, (ii) the music ministries of St. Mary's Church, especially music for Sunday morning liturgies, and (iii) the

maintenance of the organ of St. Mary's Church. Any net income not expended for the forgoing purposes during a given year may, at the discretion of the Vestry, be added to the principal of the St. Mary's Endowment Fund or held in a separate fund for future expenditure for the foregoing purposes.
