#### **Nursery School Registration:**





## Catalyst Initiative Continues!

What is happening with the Catalyst Initiative plan that was begun in March of 2023? At that time, it was discerned that a ministry of our church, and one that looks outward at the needs of the community would focus on the mental health and needs of Franklin Middle School students who walk in front of our church every day on their way home from school. Every Wednesday afternoon from 2:30 – 3:30 pm, Bonnie Lieberman, Kate Strom, Carol Holland and Janice Holsonbake greet these students with drinks and snacks, games (outdoor and indoor) and crafts. During this time, these students have a safe place to go afterschool where they know they are loved and valued. For some, it is the first time they have ever walked inside a church building.



Beginning in September, on Tuesday and Friday afternoons from 2:30 – 5:30 pm (when volunteers are available), our 308 Building hosts THRIVE, a student enrichment program, developed by Elijah Ogden, the director of the Reisterstown Youth Project (RYP). Many of the students who stay for our afterschool program on Wednesdays, participate in THRIVE on Tuesdays and Fridays.

In addition, we have been volunteering at the Franklin Middle School Store. This is another way to serve these students and demonstrate our care for their well-being.

Relationships are slowly growing in our weekly interactions with these students, whether on Wednesdays in our church, or Tuesdays and Fridays with THRIVE or during conversations at the FMS School Store.

In the Spring of 2024, we will begin offering a Young Life Mentoring Program for these Franklin Middle School student and others within the Reisterstown Community. This program will focus on the development of a 1:1 relationship to support and nurture a student, as well as share the love of Jesus Christ and share the Gospel. More information about how to get involved will be coming!

How else can our RUMC family help to continue to nurture these students?

- PRAY that these students feel loved, valued and seen through our interactions which will lead them to understand how much they are valued and loved by their Creator.
- Volunteer on Wednesday afternoons or with the Thrive program on Tuesdays and Fridays. All volunteers need to complete "Safe Gathering" training.
- Donate items for the Franklin Middle School's School Store. These students are given "Dragon Dollars" when they exhibit characteristics of PRIDE (punctuality, orderliness, respectfulness, intellectual curiosity, determination, and empathy) to spend on various items at the school store.




