Dear RUMC Family,

When my daughter was small and we would watch movies together, she had the habit of running out of the room - just out of sight of the TV. - anytime one of the protagonists found themselves in a perilous situation. When my son got old enough to watch movies with mom and dad, he wasn't much different. At the first sign of trouble, he'd ask one of us to fast forward until the characters were out of harm's way - content to watch only the "happy" parts. (I promise these were kid-friendly movies!)

It's completely natural for us to want to avoid discomfort. If life had its own remote control, I don't doubt that many of us would fast forward through the hard parts.

At the end of this month, we will conclude our Lenten journey with Jesus - and in Holy Week, we'll have the opportunity to "go with Him all the way," as the hymn says. Into Jerusalem alongside the jubilant throng who hailed Him as their King. Into the Upper Room, where He knelt to wash the feet of His friends. Into the Garden of Gethsemane, where He prayed for God to take away His suffering. Into the judgment hall of Pilate, where He was beaten and derided. Up Calvary's hill, where His body was pierced and He gave up His spirit. And finally, to the tomb, where His body was laid - only to rise again on the third day.

There is a good amount of discomfort during Holy Week. It's tempting to want to skip over the difficult parts and jump straight to our Easter celebrations. That's definitely a lot "happier." But there is something transformative in the act of staying with Jesus through it all. When we allow ourselves to enter the story; when we sit with His betrayal, abandonment and anguish; when we hear Him say "it is finished" and experience the darkness of death - it's only then that we can know the full power of the resurrection. The hope and joy of Easter belong to people who understand the gravity of human sin, the destructiveness of evil, and the triumph of our God over both.

Echoes of Belize

The Ndjungu's Mission Newsletter of February 2024

The 163rd Annual Meeting of the Belize/Honduras District of the Methodist Church in the Caribbean and the Americas (MCCA) convened from January 22-26 at Wesley Church in Belize City. Prior to the Conference, the Ministers met in Ministerial Retreat from the 18th to 20th January. The Conference met under the theme: **"Celebrating our Methodist Heritage: Pressing on for Jesus Today!"** **"Celebrando nuestra herencia Metodista: Hania adelante hoy, para Cristo."** This will be the District theme over the next year.

The Opening Devotions were led by the Rev. Elswith R. Clare, District Secretary, on Wednesday 24th January 2024. Her theme was: **"Commitment as Part of Our Heritage."** She reminded us that as Church leaders we are responsible for the quality of the heritage we pass on to succeeding generations.

CONNEXIONAL REPRESENTATIVE

The Vice President of the Connexional Conference, Dr. Hubert Morquette, a native of the Republic of Haiti, was the Connexional representative to the Conference. He brought greetings on behalf of the other Conference Officers and reminded us that the most important business of the Church is preaching Jesus Christ as Lord.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 163RD MEETING OF THE CONFERENCE

1. Election of District President/Bishop and Secretary of the District

In the MCCA, the Bishop is elected for 3 years renewable twice. After 9 consecutive years in the office, one must step down and receive a pastoral appointment. The Rev. Moses Benguche who was elected Bishop in 2018, and re-elected in 2021, couldn't make it this time. Delegates gathered at the Conference this year decided to give the leadership of the District to someone else. The Rev. Elswith R. Clare was elected as Bishop of the District (first female Bishop) and the Rev. Chrisnel Lelievre was elected Secretary of the District. They will assume their respective offices as of September 1, 2024.

2. Reception into full Connexion

The Rev. Gilroy Mark Lewis, who is in the Wesley Circuit and presently serves in the Belmopan and Hattieville Congregations, was received as minister in Full Connexion on behalf of the Connexional Conference. The date of his Ordination will be announced later. This is good news for the Methodist Church here in Belize. The Church here has only eleven active ordained ministers, and relies very much on the ministry of Lay Preachers to carry on the work of God. Of the eleven active ordained ministers, four of us are foreigners; only seven are natives of the land. There is a great need for natives to step into pastoral ministry.

Memorial Service

A memorial service was held on Thursday, 25th January, at St Luke Methodist Church in Belize City in which we remembered four servants of God who have predeceased us: Lady Leonie Cain, Sis. Vilma Ramclam, the Rev. Robert Wood and the Rev. Dr. Edgar Avita. Rev. Wood served as Superintendent of the Utila/North Coast Circuit for a few years. The Rev. Dr. Avita was the person at the General Board of Global Ministries with responsibility for our region.

3. Young People's Demonstration

Members of the Conference were delighted to share in the very positive and well-attended Youth Service at Bird's Isle in Belize City and to share in the parade thereafter.

4. Official Service

The Official Conference Service was held at Wesley Methodist Church on Sunday, January 28th. The Preacher was the District President, Bishop A. Moses Benguche. In his sermon, he recalled our history and indicated how individuals have shaped and are shaping our Methodist Heritage in Belize and Honduras. He invited the whole Church to press on even though there may be difficulties.

STATE OF THE WORK

After all the challenges imposed by almost two years of Covid, this year our churches have regained the pace of work at their full capacity. In February 2023, two seminars on Evangelism were organized in the Belize/Honduras District. The first one was held on February 18, 2023, at

Wesley College in Belize City and the second on February 25, 2023, at Mizpah Methodist Church in Utila, Honduras. Both seminars were part of the larger vision of the Strategic Plan.

- Volunteers in Missions have provided maintenance work on buildings in a number of Circuits.
- The cadre of fully accredited preachers across the District continues to be of great value to the development of the faith community.
- Home and family life has received significant attention and more persons have been attending worship.

RETIREMENT

On August 31, 2024, the Rev. Nkemba Ndjungu will go in retirement. He would have completed 40 years of ministry as a United Methodist Church Clergy and 26 years as a Global Ministries' Missionary.

Just this past January, we recognized the birthday of a man of Faith, a Nobel Peace prize winner, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Dr. King changes the rules during the mid 60's on Civil Rights for the American Negro which ultimately affected all the citizens of this great country.



In dealing with the social issues of a segregated south, his objective was to create a legal, moral, and non-violent tension to help achieve racial equality.

Dr. King was a Christian and the spirit of passive resistance came to him from the Bible and the teaching of Jesus. The techniques of the execution of this resistance came from Gandhi. Dr. King felt that he was doing God's will. He led non-violent demonstrations with 200 people of color who were willing to go to jail for the cause of racial equality. More than 3,000 negroes sang religious folk songs, negro spirituals, in the cells as they had sung in the fields.

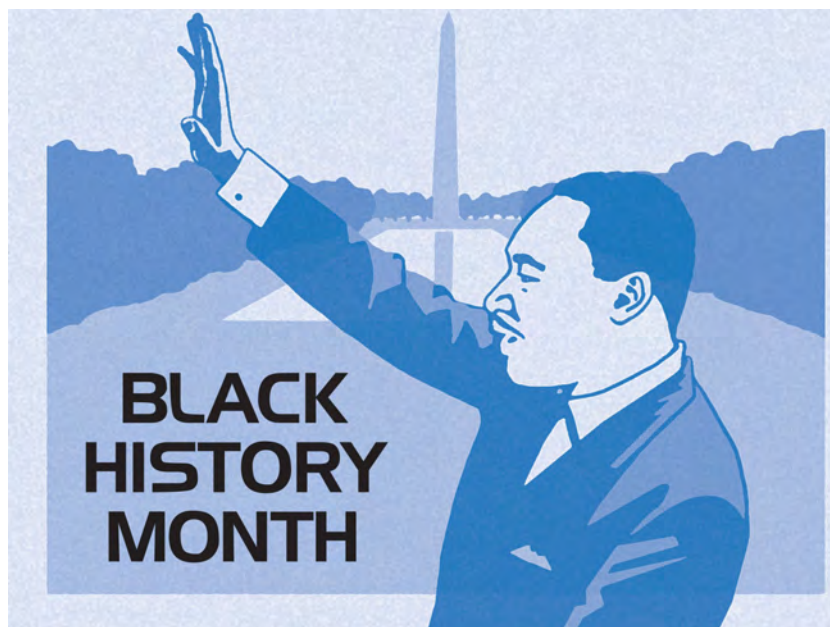

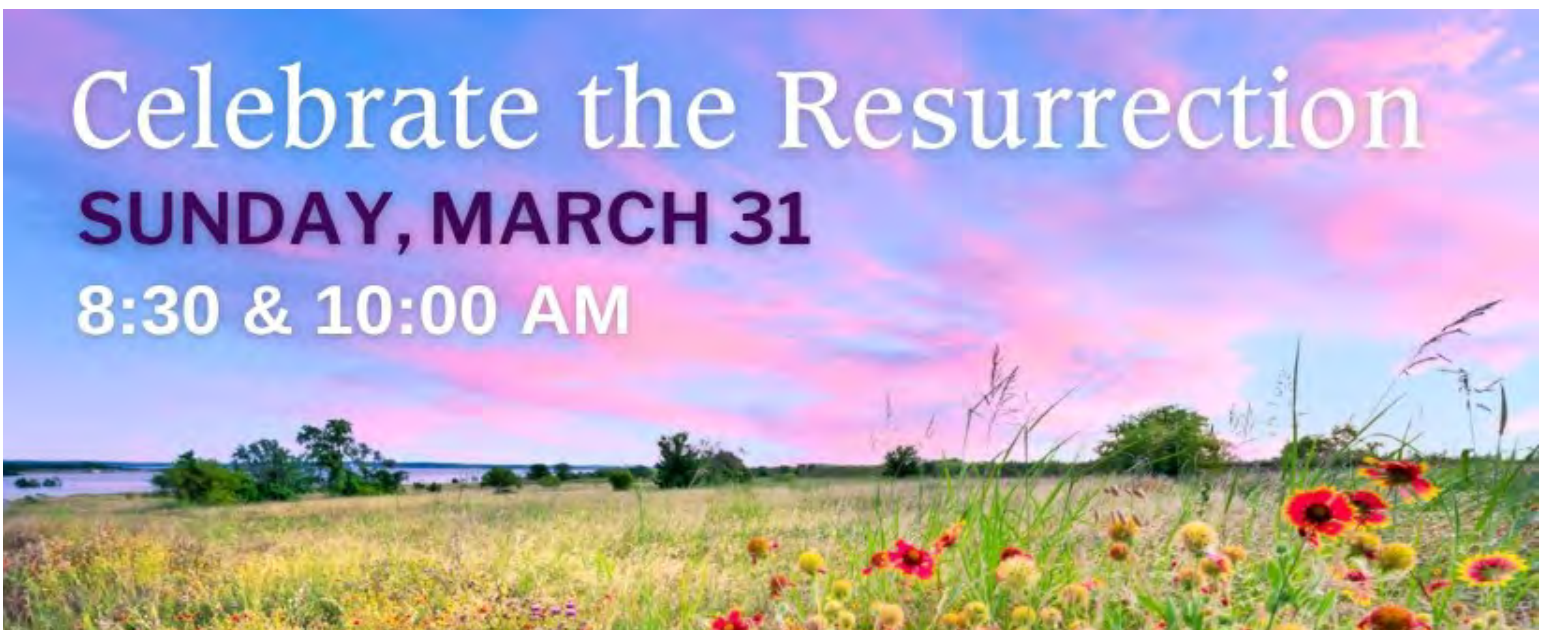
