Dear RUMC Family,

I've often heard people say that the resurrection is something that can't be proven; we just have to take it on faith. On one level, that's true. Because of the nature of the resurrection, we don't have any archaeological evidence we can point to. From an historical standpoint, though, and according to the witness of the Gospel writers, the Apostles most definitely believed in the resurrection. It became the center of their early proclamation, which led to the birth of the Church. That's why others have argued that the most compelling evidence of the resurrection is the continued existence of the Church itself.

Over the last two thousand years, the Church has endured theological debates, wars, famine, disease, clergy scandals and denominational splits—all things one might expect to lead to its undoing. How has this community of imperfect

people with imperfect leaders managed to survive—and not just *survive*, but continue to change lives, touch communities, and transform various corners of our world? It's hard to explain, unless there is power greater than ourselves at work in our midst—One who is able to make all things new and raise us from the ashes.

Our own congregation has been in existence for 247 years, and over that time, we have no doubt encountered the power of our resurrecting God. On Sunday, May 5, we will mark 50 years of worship in our current sanctuary. As we gather that Sunday, we'll take the opportunity to give thanks for all of the ways people have encountered God's presence in that space; all the ways they've been changed by God's Word; and all the lives that have subsequently been touched because those disciples have gone out into the world and put God's Word into action. Those ripples of transformation showcase the power of the resurrection.

On April 14, we'll be starting a new sermon series focused precisely on this ripple effect. It will end with the May 5 celebration highlighting all the ripples that have been felt in *Continued on page 2*

Thank you for being the Church for these young people!




