We like what we like, and we prefer to stay away from what we don't - even when it comes to the teachings of Jesus. We need other people to hold us accountable, to keep us balanced, and to challenge us when we get too comfortable. And by God's design, community is also crucial to our thriving.

On Sunday, May 19, we'll celebrate Pentecost and the day when God gave us the gift of Christian community, pouring out the Holy Spirit, who unites us all in faith and mission. We'll also have the privilege of confirming Sammi Brown and Mae Norris, who will be remembering the promises made at their baptisms and making them their own, as well as taking the vows of church membership. The notes and letters many of you sent along on their retreat were a tangible reminder of the support and encouragement we receive in the church, and they were a highlight of our time away. Thank you for being the Church for them, and for reminding them that faith is lived out best when we do it in community.

Drop off: Saturday mornings between 8:30am-11 am. Also, Sundays in the fellowship hall bin.




