Message from your Finance Team:

As your chair of Finance and your Treasurer, I want to bring your attention to a couple of things:

We can still get a rebate on any purchases made on Amazon if you use the link on the church's website to start your Amazon session. Amazon retired its Smile program, but the program we use, Amazon's affiliate program, still works. All you need to do is go to the church's website, www.rumcweb.org and click on the "Shop Amazon" button at the top of the page. Keep this in mind when you plan for your holiday shopping!!

Several of you have asked where we are with our mortgage. For those who are not aware, RUMC took on a mortgage in 2000 to renovate the Northside Chapel, purchase and renovate 308 Main Street and purchase our organ and make improvements to other areas of 246 Main Street. The current mortgage is held by the Trustees. The mortgage balance as of the end of August is \$178,509.24. At our current rate of payment, we expect to have the mortgage paid by June 2030. In 2027, we will celebrate our 250th anniversary (yes really!!). It would be wonderful if we could have a substantial amount paid if not the entire mortgage paid by then. Once the mortgage is paid, we can use the \$2400 per month we are paying on the mortgage to support the mission and ministries of the church. Please consider an extra gift to the church to help with the mortgage or maybe you would consider leaving RUMC a gift in your estate planning.

October 20th is the order date for Gift Cards.






