Dear RUMC Family,

We are quickly approaching November 5, and I am reminded of something John Wesley recorded in his journal 250 years ago this month. In an entry dated October 6, 1774, he wrote,

I met those of our society who had votes in the ensuing election, and advised them:

- 1. To vote, without fee or reward, for the person they judged most worthy
- 2. To speak no evil of the person they voted against, and
- 3. To take care their spirits were not sharpened against those that voted on the other side.

Wesley assumed that Christians would exercise their faith in the political realm—not as a means to seek power, but as a way to enact God's vision of wholeness for the world.

Today our United Methodist Social Principles affirm the same idea: "Our involvement in political systems is rooted in the Gospel imperative to love our neighbors, to do justice, and to care for the vulnerable" (\P_{32}). Along with advocating for justice, sharing our resources, and serving those in need, voting is one of the tools we have at our disposal for loving our neighbors.

It's easy to get pulled into the drama of election season and very tempting to fall into divisive rhetoric. Yet as the people of God, we are called to be different—to be set apart—and to be known above all for our love. Whether it's in how we treat one another, how we engage in difficult conversations, or in how we use our privilege—in this case, our vote—we have an opportunity to bear witness to the love of Jesus, who came not to be served but to serve, and who set for us an example of humility and self-giving.

It's easy to succumb to anxiety as we await the outcome of Tuesday's vote. In our increasingly polarized political system, the stakes feel high, and a lot feels uncertain—including how people will respond to the results. I invite us to join together in prayer—both for peace within and without —and in placing our ultimate hope in Christ. Because regardless of what happens on November 5, our calling on November 6 will be the same—to transform the world as we follow Jesus in lifting up the lowly, setting free those who are oppressed, and making God's love visible.

As your chair of Finance and your Treasurer, I want to bring your attention to a couple of things: We can still get a rebate on any purchases made on Amazon if you use the link on the


church's website to start your Amazon session. Amazon retired its Smile program, but the program we use, Amazon's affiliate program, still works. All you need to do is go to the church's website,

Family Ministry News





Board of Childcare


