#### Dear Church Family,

In worship this past Sunday, we joined our voices in singing, "For the Beauty of the Earth," giving thanks to God for the natural world that surrounds us, as well as for the love, joy, and relationships that enrich our lives. As we consider all the beautiful gifts that God has given us, words alone seem insufficient to express our gratitude. God has been so generous to us—what can we do in return, other than to offer God the gift of our lives?

One of the most important ways we can show our thanks

to God is by loving and caring for the things that God loves. Most often when we imagine doing this, we think of God's *people*. We love God by loving our neighbors. But we also express our love for God by caring for the world that God made—protecting it and preserving it for future generations.

With this in mind, the Church Council and Trustees are excited to share that our congregation will be taking a meaningful step in our commitment to caring for God's creation. After careful consideration and planning, we have made the decision to install a solar canopy in our church parking lot. This project will not only reduce our carbon footprint but also eliminate the majority of our monthly electric bill.

The decision to go solar aligns with our values as stewards of both the environment and the financial resources God has provided. By transitioning to solar energy, we are reducing our reliance on nonrenewable energy sources and decreasing the church's environmental impact. Additionally, this change will help us save money on utility costs, freeing up more funds for ministry and outreach programs that make a life-changing impact in the community.

Groundbreaking for the canopy will begin over the winter months, and until it is completed, a portion of our parking lot will be unavailable. We have already begun conversations with our Main Street neighbors to ensure that we will have ample parking for large events, such as our Holy Week and Easter services. We are hopeful that the canopy will be fully functional by the summer, and we will begin experiencing its benefits immediately. For additional information, check out the Q&A at

#### Q&A:

#### Why did we choose a parking lot canopy vs. rooftop panels?

The Trustees spent more than half of 2024 in an exploration process, assisted by a consultant named Wade Sewell, who has worked with other United Methodist churches in the Baltimore-Washington Conference. While our initial conversations were about the installation of rooftop panels, a review of the advantages and disadvantages led the Trustees and Church Council to support the installation of a canopy instead. A canopy will allow for easier maintenance and upgrades as solar technology changes in the coming decades. It will also offer shaded parking and the ability to provide electric car charging stations. Lastly, it means that we will not risk damage to our new sanctuary roof.

#### How will we pay for the project?

We are blessed to have the Turnbaugh Trust, a generous gift provided by J. Walter and Eleanor Turnbaugh. While the TTT cannot be used for the church's operating expenses, it can fund capital improvements such as this one, as well as projects that align with the mission of RUMC's library. By signing the contract and beginning the permitting process in this calendar year, we also have access to large state and federal subsidies to offset our cost. The canopy is projected to become cost-neutral in year eight, but funding from the TTT will make it possible for us to see savings in our monthly operating expenses as soon as the project is completed.

#### How much will we save with this transition to solar?

Initial projections suggest that we will save approximately \$28,000 per year in utility costs. However, the canopy design we have selected will provide more electric energy than our church currently uses. This offers exciting stewardship options going forward, including the potential to move away from gas for heating our buildings to a geothermal heating approach down the road. Ultimately, we could eliminate our dependence on non-renewable energy sources altogether.

The Trustees will provide regular updates on the status of the solar project in the coming months. Party. All of our thanks go to Judy Wright and Joann Ditto for providing us with such a wonderful evening to help kick off the holiday season.


Our book, The Wishing Bridge, was a treat taking us to the famed German Christmas Villages of Michigan. The dog was still alive at the end of the book...always a good sign.

## For the Young and Young at Heart



Make a catch of fish to show what happens when Jesus calls his first disciples.

#### What you need:

- Cardboard egg carton
- Acrylic paint
- Paintbrush
- Darning needle
- Fishing twine
- Scissors
- Googly eyes or buttons
- Glue



#### What you do:


- From the egg carton, cut out the 12 cups. From the lid, cut out two fish tails.
- On a protected surface, turn the cups upside down. Paint the outside of each cup and both sides of the tails. Let dry.
- 3. Thread the needle with an arm's length of twine. Tie a knot at the end.
- 4. Thread the needle through the end of the tail. Tie another knot an inch from the tail.
- Thread the needle through one upside-down cup. Pull the twine through until the cup rests on the knot.
- 6. Continue tying knots an inch above each cup and threading on another cup until you've strung six cups. Tie a knot above the last cup and leave a long string to hang the fish. (You can make two fish with each egg carton.)
- 7. Add googly eyes or buttons to the last cup to make a face.

When fishermen obeyed Jesus and let down their nets, they caught so many fish that their boats began to sink! Simon Peter fell at Jesus' knees. What happened next?


