#### Dear RUMC Family,

During last month's Ash Wednesday service, we were invited to make an intentional start to the season of Lent by taking on spiritual practices like prayer, fasting, and reading and meditating on God's Word. As United Methodists, we tend to focus on the first and last of those three disciplines, with fasting often getting overlooked. Part of the reason for that, I think, is that many of us have been conditioned to associate the word "fasting" with total abstinence from food - a choice that is not healthy or practical for most.

We assume that fasting is simply about sacrifice. We forsake something to help us identify with Jesus in His suffering; we give up food to help us be mindful of people who are hungry; we give up soda and specialty drinks to

help us appreciate that not everyone has access to clean water. However, fasting can also help us clear the clutter from our lives, whether it's the constant buzz of the television, the time-suck that is the internet, or the literal clutter that emerges from our love of shopping. Fasting can be an opportunity to invite God into those spaces we usually fill with distractions.

In my own life, fasting has taken many forms over the years. During Lent, I've fasted from caffeine, fast food, TV, Facebook. I've "fasted" in the sense of clearing space for God and adding in a spiritual practice...setting aside more devotional time, adopting a letter-writing practice, or making a more intentional effort at self-care. I've also known many people who have practiced fasting as a way to give. When we choose to fast from something that costs money— like dining out or specialty drinks—we can use the money we save to support a cause that reflects God's love and justice. In that vein, this year's Lenten Offering is for the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), which provides essential aid to people in need in the U.S. and around the world.

On Ash Wednesday, we raised \$1,942 for UMCOR, and we will collect another offering during the Maundy Thursday service. If you haven't done so already, I encourage you to consider fasting in order to give to this important mission.

Fasting during Lent is more than just a personal sacrifice—it challenges us to rethink our priorities, clear the clutter from our lives, and make space for God. Perhaps in the remaining weeks of Lent, you might fast from something that distracts you, whether it's a treat, social media, or a habit that keeps you from fully engaging with God. Or, you might adopt a type of fasting that frees you to be

more generous toward something that is close to God's heart.

If you haven't ever tried fasting, I invite you to consider it. Let it be an intentional practice that opens your heart to God and prepares you to serve others. No matter our Lenten practices, may they continue to draw us closer to God and help us better live out God's mission in the world.

#### Trustees Update: RUMC Solar Project

Since the March newsletter, we have the following updates to share on the installation of RUMC's solar canopy:

- We have received Interconnect approval from BGE.
- Design documents and permit set have been submitted to Baltimore County for approval.
- The foundation cages for the carport will be delivered in early April, and the steel will be delivered during the second or third week of April.

**Next Steps:** The construction of the carport will likely begin mid-April with drilling for the foundation piers. The foundation piers must cure for at least a week prior to adding the steel.



#### Update on the Mortgage from your Finance Committee: GOOD NEWS!!!

Through the generosity of the Chambers Foundation and the congregation, we have applied an additional \$13,433.07 to the principal of our mortgage. When we started our appeal for help to pay off the mortgage by 2027, the balance of the mortgage was

\$169,134.21. As of the end of March, the balance is \$146,302.93. We still have a long way to go to pay off the mortgage by our 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary, but we are certainly closer than we were!!!

Even if you are not able to give anything extra, your giving does help pay down the mortgage because our budget includes \$29,000 each year for principal and interest.

Getting a tax refund this year? Maybe you can consider donating some of it to help us continue to pay off the mortgage. Imagine what we could do with \$29,000 dedicated to ministry rather than the mortgage?

Watch for updates in the newsletter and maybe even something showing our progress somewhere in the church...






