Dear RUMC Family,

Last spring, The United Methodist Church unveiled a new vision statement: *The United Methodist Church forms disciples of Jesus Christ who, empowered by the Holy Spirit, love boldly, serve joyfully, and lead courageously in local communities and worldwide connections.* While a mission statement describes what we *do*, a vision statement declares who we *are*. That means we are meant to be followers of Jesus who love boldly, serve joyfully, and lead courageously.

*Loving Boldly* is the theme of this year’s Annual Conference scheduled for later this month. Specifically, we’ll focus on the call to “passionately love God and, like Jesus, embrace and include people of every age, nation, race, gender, and walk of life.”

As I’ve watched RUMC in action, I believe that this is one of the things that our congregation does particularly well. Last week, I had the privilege of sharing with the Franklin Middle School PTA that our congregation collected over \$3500 to stock the new hygiene pantry being built for students and their families. They were blown away by our generosity and our support of our community’s children!

This summer, we will have another opportunity to love boldly together. We are currently in discussions with *Sleep in Heavenly Peace* (SHP) of Howard County to host a bed build, which will provide new beds, mattresses and bedding for children in our community who don’t currently have one. Sleep in Heavenly Peace is a nationwide organization that builds beds for children ages 3-17. Their motto is “No Kid Sleeps on the Floor in Our Town!” In addition to providing kids with quality sleep that allows them to be their best selves, beds also offer children dignity and hope. There will be more information coming soon about how you can support this hands-on mission opportunity—

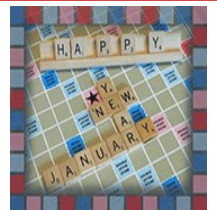
## GAME NIGHT

**PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE DONATIONS OUTSIDE ANY CHURCH DOORS OR THE FOOD PANTRY**

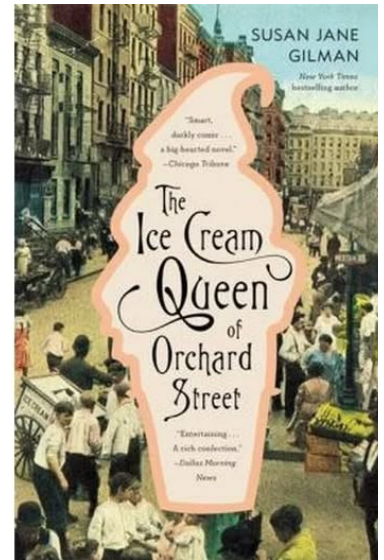


The RUMC Book Club had another successful meeting . On May 21 we will review: *The Ice Cream Queen of Orchard Street* by Susan Gilman

**A clever and complex woman builds an ice cream empire after immigrating from Russia in this stunning novel of power, Prohibition, and performance set against the backdrop of early 20th-century America.**

In 1913, little Malka Treynovsky flees Russia with her family. Bedazzled by tales of gold and movie stardom, she tricks them into buying tickets for America. Yet no sooner do they land on the squalid Lower East Side of Manhattan, than Malka is crippled and abandoned in the street.

Taken in by a tough-loving Italian ices peddler, she manages to survive through cunning and inventiveness. As she learns the secrets of his trade, she begins to shape her own destiny. She falls in love with a gorgeous, illiterate radical named Albert, and they set off across America in an ice cream truck. Slowly, she transforms herself into Lillian Dunkle, "The Ice Cream Queen" - doyenne of an empire of ice cream franchises and a celebrated television personality.



Lillian's rise to fame and fortune spans seventy years and is inextricably linked to the course of American history itself, from Prohibition to the disco days of Studio 54. Yet Lillian Dunkle is nothing like the whimsical motherly persona she crafts for herself in the media. Conniving, profane, and irreverent, she is a supremely complex woman who prefers a good stiff drink to an ice cream cone. And when her past begins to catch up with her, everything she has spent her life building is at stake.

# GROWING IN GOD'S word



Try this craft as a reminder that we need to continue to grow in God's Word.

### What you need:

- Small terra cotta pot and plate
- Acrylic paints (various colors)
- Paper plate
- Potting soil (enough to fill the pot)
- Small inside plant or packet of seeds
- Newspaper or paper
- Paintbrush
- Cup of water
- Permanent black marker



### What you do:

1. Spread some newspaper out on a table for your working area.
2. Squeeze the paint colors that you wish to use onto your paper plate.
3. Paint designs on the pot and plate.
4. When the pot is dry, take the black marker and on the top part of the pot write: Growing in God's Word.
5. Pour a small amount of potting soil into the bottom of the pot. With adults help, place your plant into the pot and surround your plant with the rest of the soil. If planting seeds, follow the packet instructions.
6. Water your plant so the soil is moist. Check your plant everyday and keep the soil moist.
7. Enjoy watching your plant grow, and remember that you too, need care as you grow in God's Word.

**\*\*Student Loan Agreement:** The Linwood Cross/Margaret Griffin-Scott Yohn student loan funds of the Reisterstown United Methodist Church are made available to young people who are **active** members of the church. The following conditions apply to anyone who applies and makes use of these funds.

**Linwood Cross Fund** - All loans made to students who enter the ministry, missionary or deaconess field, conference or denominational staff, minister of education or music, or other fields of work in the United Methodist Church will be in the form of a grant and no repayment is required. If the recipient enters the field of nursing or teaching, 50% repayment is required after graduation. For any other field, full repayment is required.

**Griffin-Yohn Fund**— All loans are interest free. Full repayment is required after graduation.

**Repayment terms for both funds are as follows:** One year after leaving school all loans are outstanding and payable. The loans are to be repaid at an amount and frequency determined by the recipient. It is suggested that payments are made monthly or quarterly to guarantee availability of funds for future applicants.

**Signatures of the applicant and parent/legal guardian are required to confirm understanding of these terms and to signify a pledge to use the money for educational expenses only.**
