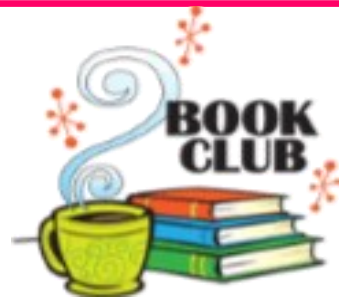
**At this time we are NOT accepting donations of clothing or household items.**

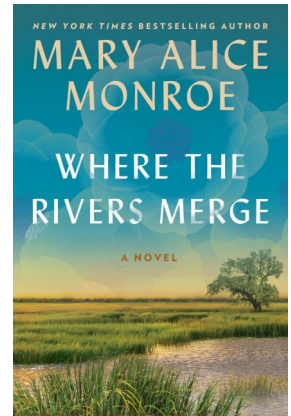

**Sleep in Heavenly Peace Bed Build:**  
**SUNDAY, JUNE 14**  
**after Worship**  
**Ages 12+**  
**(10+ with adult)**

**Do you like to knit, crochet or sew? Do you have a treasure of cotton fabric or acrylic yarn?** If you answer "Yes" to any of these questions, then we need your help!! I am organizing anyone interested in making blankets/quilts to go with the beds RUMC is making for our *Sleep In Heavenly Peace* project. Many of us are not handy with tools, but we are handy with a needle and thread or yarn. Please plan to join the group on Sunday, June 14th. We will work on blankets and quilts in the Fellowship Hall while others are building outside.

**Please bring any one or several of the items listed below:**

- Yourself and a willingness to help
- Yarn that is colorful
- A project you want to work on during our Sunday session
- Fabric that is "kid" friendly
- Leftover "Charm" pack squares (if you are a quilter you know what that is)
- If you have a sewing machine that is easy to bring, feel free.
- If you have any fabric in 2-yard lengths that you are willing to part with, this can be used for backing

**What we will provide:**

- A place to work and fellowship with others
- Plenty of 5" squares and 2.5" strips you can choose from for your project (it takes about 150 5" squares to make a quilt 45" X 60").
- Cutting mats, rulers and rotary cutters
- A basic pattern to get you started but feel free to design your own.
- As we work to assemble the quilts, batting will be provided.

**We will follow the rules for *Project Linus* blankets: make blankets from NEW, CLEAN, washable materials in child or teen friendly colors.**

- Cotton fabric, flannel, and medium weight fleece and acrylic yarn are the best choices.
- Do not use any of the following materials: tapestry, burlap, upholstery fabric, 70's type double knit, felt, vinyl or wool. In general, these choices are not washable, or soft and cuddly.
- Do not use print fabrics that include specific faith based, sectarian messages, religious, or holiday themes. We cannot guarantee to match the theme and the child.
- Do not use fabrics printed with "mommy" or "daddy" or "grandmother," or "grandfather." We cannot guarantee to match the theme and the child.
- Do not attach buttons, bells, or bows or other decorative embellishments such as glitter beads, sequins, as they are likely choking hazards, can snag and tangle with medical equipment and can be rough and scratchy.
- Do not use thick fabric paint on the surface of your blanket. You might use permanent fabric markers made specifically for coloring muslin.
- Do not use fabric that has been stored in a damp area or materials with a musty smell. The mold spores can cause allergic reactions and are very difficult to remove from any fabric.

If you want to make your own blanket/quilt, please do so. We just ask that it be approximately 45" X 60". You can also purchase no-sew fleece blanket kits I look forward to working on this project with you. Any suggestions you have would be greatly appreciated!!

**\*\*Student Loan Agreement:** The Linwood Cross/Margaret Griffin-Scott Yohn student loan funds of the Reisterstown United Methodist Church are made available to young people who are **active** members of the church. The following conditions apply to anyone who applies and makes use of these funds.

**Linwood Cross Fund** - All loans made to students who enter the ministry, missionary or deaconess field, conference or denominational staff, minister of education or music, or other fields of work in the United Methodist Church will be in the form of a grant and no repayment is required. If the recipient enters the field of nursing or teaching, 50% repayment is required after graduation. For any other field, full repayment is required.

**Griffin-Yohn Fund**— All loans are interest free. Full repayment is required after graduation.

**Repayment terms for both funds are as follows:** One year after leaving school all loans are outstanding and payable. The loans are to be repaid at an amount and frequency determined by the recipient. It is suggested that payments are made monthly or quarterly to guarantee availability of funds for future applicants.

**Signatures of the applicant and parent/legal guardian are required to confirm understanding of these terms and to signify a pledge to use the money for educational expenses only.**
