3. Please explain the ways Jesus suffered for us in verses 4-6, 7-8.

4. What do verses 4-6 say about where the heart of Israel (and of most of the world's) was when He did it. What does this tell you about the heart of God toward us?

5. What hope do verses 4-6 give the person who struggles with:

- a. Self-rule?

b. Self-indulgence?

c. Self-pity?

d. Self-protection?

6. Please read 1 Peter 2:21-23.

a. How does God want us to respond to Jesus’ sacrifice?

b. What obstacles get in the way in your own life?

c. What truths about Jesus give you courage to overcome the obstacles?
