

IMPACT GROUP QUESTIONS

KEY PASSAGE: 1 PETER 3:7, PSALM 15:1-5

Opening: What truths impacted you most from the sermon/passage? *Be a student of your wife. Understand her deeply and protect her well; Honor God with your actions and words; Surround yourself with friends who truly love Jesus, and never abuse a friendship.*

INFORM THE HEAD/STIR THE HEART

Please read 1 Peter 3:7, Psalm 15 and answer the following questions:

1. 1 Peter 3:7 starts with the word “likewise” as it did for the wife in verse 1. Please read 1 Peter 2:21-23 and explain what the “likewise” is referring to.

2. What reasons do you find in 1 Peter 3:7 to show your wife honor? Please list the opposite of those reasons and explain why doing those things wouldn’t show her honor.

3. 1 Peter 3:7 says, “so that your prayers may not be hindered.”

- a. Why is it important that our prayers aren’t hindered?

- b. Please explain from the following passages what other things hinder our prayers.

- i. Psalm 66:18

ii. Proverbs 28:9

iii. James 4:2

iv. James 4:3

4. From Psalm 15, please list the actions of a godly man (or woman), and their opposites. How does doing the things listed in Psalm 15 impact our relationship with the Lord and with others?
