Opening: What truths impacted you most from the sermon/passage? INFORM THE HEAD/STIR THE HEART

Please read Psalm 139:13-24 and answer the following questions:

1. Please use verses 13-16 to explain why the God-given desires of authority and control in our lives can only truly be filled by Him.

2. Please compare verses 17-18 with verses 2 and 4. What insight does this give you about how big God is and how small we are?

3. Why do you think the psalmist says, "I awake, and I am still with You" at the end of verse 18?

4. How do verses 19-22 help us clarify where our loyalties lie? For what reasons would we be tempted to align ourselves with those who stand against God?

5. In verses 21-22, the Psalmist calls out a hatred he has. Why is hatred in this case righteous and not sinful? What insight does that give us for how we must see all pleasures and attentions from anything and anyone other than our King?

6. Looking over the whole chapter, what do you see about God that makes humbly asking Him to search our hearts and lead us a worthy thing to do?
