YEAR END GIVING

- Cash or check made payable to Presbyterian Church of Madison. If you make a cash donation, please provide your name so that we can acknowledge it for your tax records.
- Appreciated securities may be transferred to our Merrill Lynch account – contact Alexandra in the church office for the details necessary to accomplish this. Merrill Lynch will sell the securities and the cash will be transferred to the church checking account.
- If you are 70½ or older, you may make a Qualified Charitable Distribution from your IRA, and if you are subject to Required Minimum Distributions, the amount of the QCD will count toward the RMD.

Since the latter two options require some time for processing, please be sure to contact your broker or IRA custodian early in the month so that they can be completed by December 31.

DIAPER COLLECTION THROUGH DECEMBER 24-CHRISTMAS EVE SERVICE

A long standing PCM mission project has been the collection of diapers for babies and children at Christmas time, to be donated to the Interfaith Food Pantry. Last year we also started collecting and donating adult incontinence products.

Why Donate Diapers for Babies & Young Children

According to the National Diaper Bank Network's June 2023 report, diaper need has increased sharply in 2023. In their recent study approximately 47% of families reported a need. In the first diaper need investigation in 2010 and in several subsequent studies, approximately 33% of families reported diaper need.

Families who experience food insecurity are also usually unable to purchase diapers, and if they don't have diapers to provide to day care centers they miss work days. Diapers are an essential need for the health and hygiene of babies and toddlers. An inadequate supply of diapers increases a child's risk for diaper rash and other infections.

Why Donate Adult Incontinence Products

Products such as Depends are medically necessary for those managing bladder and bowel incontinence. Many seniors are living on fixed incomes. With the rate of inflation being high it is difficult for older adults to afford these products that are necessary for them to lead a full and active life.
