MADISON EAGLE CHRISTMAS FUND BRIGHTENS THE HOLIDAYS FOR HUNDREDS

As in decades past, PCM is lending its support to the Madison Eagle Christmas Fund (MECF). The MECF has served Madison families and seniors in financial need for over 50 years. In 2023, the charity provided assistance to close to 500 of our Madison neighbors, including 200 children. The Fund provides gift cards for essentials such as groceries, gas, and warm clothing, but then gives the recipients the unique ability to select gift cards from a list of over 30 Madison shops and food establishments. The Fund's unique approach gives parents the joy and dignity of shopping for gifts they know their children will most enjoy, and gives seniors the independence to choose a place for a special meal or a gift for themselves.

Look for the small Christmas tree in the narthex with paper ornaments displaying various suggested dollar donations for MECF.

You can support this outreach by selecting an ornament and submitting a check for the chosen amount by Sunday, December 8.

Make the check out to the Presbyterian Church of Madison with MECF noted in the memo area, and place it in the offering plate or drop it off at the church office.

OPERATION HOLIDAY - GIFTS FOR CHILDREN

This year we have chosen to provide gifts for four children currently in one of the programs of Homeless Solutions – a 6-year-old girl and her 4-year-old brother and an 8-year-old girl and her 2-year-old brother. The tree in the narthex also has ornaments with the items from their wish lists. Please take one or more and sign up on the sheet so we can follow up, if necessary. The wrapped gifts, with the ornament attached, should be returned to the narthex by December 8 or the church office by December 10.

WHITE OFFERING

A long standing PCM mission project has been the collection of diapers for babies and children at Christmas time, to be donated to the Interfaith Food Pantry. Two years ago we also started collecting and donating adult incontinence products.

Why Donate Diapers for Babies & Young Children

According to the National Diaper Bank Network's June 2023 report, diaper need has increased sharply in recent years. In their recent study, approximately 47% of families reported a need. In the first diaper need investigation in 2010 and in several subsequent studies, approximately 33% of families reported diaper need. Families who experience food insecurity are also usually unable to purchase diapers, and if they don't have diapers to provide to day care centers, they miss work days. Diapers are an essential need for the health and hygiene of babies and toddlers. An inadequate supply of diapers increases a child's risk for diaper rash and other infections.

Why Donate Adult Incontinence Products

Products such as Depends are medically necessary for those managing bladder and bowel incontinence. Many seniors are living on fixed incomes. With the rate of inflation being high it is difficult for older adults to afford these products that are necessary for them to lead a full and active life. These items are also not funded by public assistance programs.

Your offerings can be placed under the Christmas tree in the sanctuary or in the bin outside the office in the Parish House.


