- 1. Why do you think Jesus used the metaphor of "debts" to describe sin in the Lord's Prayer?
- 2. What makes it difficult to forgive someone who has wronged us?
 - * How does understanding God's forgiveness toward us help us extend forgiveness to others?
- 3. Jesus connects our forgiveness from God with our willingness to forgive others (Matthew 6:14-15). Why do you think He emphasizes this so strongly?
 - * Can you think of a time when forgiving someone brought healing to a relationship or inner peace to yourself?
- 4. What practical steps can we take to forgive others, even when it feels impossible?
 - * Is there someone in your life whom God may be calling you to forgive? What would it look like to take the first step?

Prayer Vigil: The Elders are setting next Saturday, October 26th as a 24-hour prayer vigil and requesting members to take specific 30 minute slots to pray for this congregation, for God's revelation, and for needs of our community. You may sign up in Connect or the sheet available in the gym.

When prayers are reduced to techniques or formulas as a means of manipulating God, they are wrong. Jesus recalled that true prayer depends on what is in the heart more than what is on the tongue.

Prayer was never intended to inform God of something he doesn't know. The point of prayer isn't merely to get what we want but to nurture our relationship with God. As a result, prayer can change us rather than the situation, reinforcing our confidence in our God's sufficiency and realigning our will with his. At the same time, God invites us to involve ourselves in his work by praying.

Our Wednesday night class will continue in John Mark Comer's book *The Prayer Practice*. You are encouraged to keep a prayer journal to chronicle your time in this journey.

Stories of Encouraging Prayers - If you have a story where God answered a prayer (with a yes, no, or wait a little bit), and you would like to share it with the congregation, let Brian know, and you can share it on Sunday mornings or he will be happy to share it for you. Also, it can be anonymous if you're uncomfortable with your name being put out in front of everyone. He understands.
