

MINISTRIES

To be the hands and feet of Jesus

Our Heritage by David Jackson

No matter where we have come from, no matter how old we are, no matter our health status or ability to function, we are all indebted to the past. Past people, past events, past circumstances all combine to make the person we are right now. We owe a debt to those who came before us, and most of us don't know who they are.

The content of the Bible, including the Old Testament, tells us about those who came long before us, the successes and the failures of people who were called by God to his service. Some of them rose to the level of "heroes of the faith" (for example, the list in Hebrews 11) and received praise from God. Others showed the way to avoid, and the consequences of ignoring God's word.

God wanted us to know about those people who influenced our past so we could learn from them. Our culture has changed, our challenges are different, our language has changed, and we dress differently than the people in the Bible. But human nature is the same, and the One who guided them still offers to guide us, if we will follow. The biggest difference is that they lived *before* God sent his son, and we live *after* the coming of Jesus.

We know the whole story. We know how their lives turned out and who was deemed faithful to the calling from God. We know the mystery of how God planned to overcome Satan and bring his people to be with him. We even know how history will end, and there is no doubt that God wins! The same God who created the world guided his people in the past, and we can read about his care for them in the things that have been written in the past. He is the very same God who promises to be with us, to care for us, to keep his promises to us.

As the author of Hebrews assures us, "God has said, 'Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you.' So we say with confidence, 'The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid. What can mere mortals do to me?'" (Hebrews 13:5-6)
