For kids ages 3 through kindergarten, we offer "children's worship" during the sermon. After worshipping with their family during the first part of the service, kids ages 3 through kindergarten will be invited to join our leaders at the front of the sanctuary. After the sermon, the kids return to the sanctuary to meet their parents.



Together as the people of God, we acknowledge honestly to God what is wrong and broken in us and ask for his forgiveness and transforming grace.


God Declares Our Forgiveness

Now let us celebrate the feast of the kingdom of our Lord Jesus Christ.


Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again. Come quickly, Lord Jesus!


