Excerpts from December 12, 2023 Board Meeting

Helen Earls gave the opening devotion and prayer. Minutes from the November 14, 2023, meeting were approved by general consensus.

Pastor's Report: Ministers report was attached. There are several individuals planning to be baptized and join the church in December.

Treasurer: Michelle Hart presented information from the report - as of November 30, 2023:

Unrestricted Operating Checking \$100,000. The total transfer to the building fund in October was \$7,726.24. Total Funds in the bank available for Construction/Renovation \$1,556,870.96. Total Funds including remaining pledges: \$1,606,307.38. Kathy Hull moved to approve the Treasurer's Report and Roger Brokaw seconded. Passed unanimously.

Christian Education: Pastor Michael stated the youth have been busy with church activities including caroling.

Music: Kayla stated she is busy with preparations for the Cantata and Christmas Eve service.

Crossroads Center: Shari Clark submitted a report. Pastor Michael added that the walk-in cooler roof has been resurfaced to fix the leak. Work continues on sealing the cooler bottom area.

Building Team: Brad Losch stated we will resume pursuing the building project in early 2024.

New Business:

Pastor Michael reminded everyone that 2023 year end reports will soon be due.

Brad Losch stated Abigail Heavner has submitted her resignation as Nursery Attendant effective January 1, 2024. The Executive Committee has some ideas for a replacement and is also open to suggestions.

The church staff was asked to exit the room while year-end bonuses were discussed.

Roger Brokaw stated our roadside signs at the entrance to Pittsfield might need updated. He also stated we could add the church info to the YouVersion Bible app.

Helen Earls addressed the board as this was her final meeting before moving to Georgia next month after a lifetime of service to FCC. She gave words of encouragement in several areas including the building project and our search for an associate pastor. Helen stated FCC has a lot to be thankful for.

Adjourn: The Motion to Adjourn was made by Kathy Hull and seconded by Brad Willman. The motion passed unanimously, and the meeting adjourned at 5:40PM.

Closing Prayer: Pastor Michael gave the closing prayer.

How Do I Say Goodbye?

First, I want to say it has been such an honor and privilege to serve First Christian Church of Pittsfield. When I first accepted the elder position over 20 years ago, I was really unsure of myself. Our team of Youth leaders and Sunday School teachers understand this and are committed. I pray you will continue to send these leaders to Orange Conference. It is such a valuable resource!!!

Crossroads taught me to trust God in all things and to keep Him in all things. It also taught me that when it is God's will and we respond, He will use it for good. It also taught me how much fun it can be when we work together for God's glory even in mundane things. I have gotten close to so many people through my work at Crossroads both in the church and in the community. Many people came to be church people through some of these activities over the years at Crossroads. It has been such a blessing and I pray it continues to be a blessing not only to our church but also to the community which we are called to serve.

I have never felt better about the future of First Christian Church. Kayla is a blessing beyond measure to the church.
