Excerpts from January 9, 2024 Board Meeting

Call to order at 5:59 PM by Moderator Brad Losch. N.D. Harrison led the meeting in prayer.

Treasurer: Eleanor Jenkins submitted a report and presented information from the report– as of December 31, 2023: The total transfer to the building fund in December was \$28,051.62. Total Funds Available for Construction/Renovation \$1,594,592.09.

Trustees: Dan Speckhart submitted a Trustee Report. He indicated that he is renewing 3-month CDs with Raymond James as they mature; interest rates vary but are currently at around 5.1%. Church insurance will expire on 2/19/2024 so Trustees are working to obtain quotes from various agencies.

Christian Education: Kacie Lipcaman submitted a report. Youth group will host a lock-in on MLK Day weekend, and plans are underway for the Valentine's Dinner on 2/18/2024.

Crossroads Center: Shari Clark submitted a report. Roger Brokaw noted that the primary election on 3/19 will need to be added to the schedule.

Building Team: Moderator Brad Losch provided a report: building team meetings will resume on 1/22/2024 and will explore a few of the current options to move forward.

Old Business:

Roger Brokaw is working to add FCC to the YouVersion App church directory.

Church Representation:

MVCSC: Brad Losch stated that Rod Gordley has been the FCC representative for the MVCSC Board; he presumes that Rod will continue in this role but needs to confirm.

Pike County Unmet Needs: Julie Boren has accepted assignment to Unmet Needs Board, pending FCC Board approval

Pickleball Tournament: Terri Wombles attended to ask the Board permission to host a Women's Pickleball Tournament on Saturday, March 2 (inclement weather date: March 3). 2-woman teams would be charged \$20, and proceeds would go to Pike County Unmet Needs. She needs permission and clarification on the following before moving forward in planning: 1.) Does the Board give permission 2) Would the Board consider waiving/reducing the rental fee? 3) Does FCC liability insurance cover this type of event, or would the organizers need to have participants sign a liability waiver? In response, the Board expressed universal desire to see this event take place; David Bishop said that we need to pull out the rental policy, to verify that events supporting non-profits should be held rent -free at Crossroads. Kathy Hull suggested that the organizers obtain their own event insurance. David Bishop moved to approve the Pickleball Tournament on March 2, waiving the rental cost, pending policy review. Spencer Boren seconded; motion carried.

The Motion to Adjourn was made by David Bishop and seconded by Kathy Hull. The motion passed unanimously, and the meeting adjourned at 6:44PM. Kathy Hull closed the meeting in prayer.
