Excerpts from February 13, 2024 Church Board Meeting

Call to order at 6:09 PM by Moderator Brad Losch. Wayne Chamberlain led the meeting in prayer. Minutes from the January 9, 2024, meeting were approved by general consensus.

Pastor's Report: Ministers report was attached. Pastor Michael has been working on contacting a builder and Jacques Reynolds regarding the building project. Good Friday plans are in the works. Local tragedy at the high school brought opportunities to minister in the community.

Treasurer: Eleanor Jenkins submitted a report and presented information from the report—as of January 31, 2024:

The total transfer to the building fund in January was \$2,178.58

Total Funds Available for Construction/Renovation \$1,605,712.55

Average YTD worship attendance through January 31: 264

David Bishop moved to approve the Treasurer's Report and Kathy Hull seconded. Passed unanimously.

Trustees: Brad Losch reported on behalf of Dan Speckhart: CDs are still being renewed for 1–3-month terms at 5.1%. After discussion, Kathy Hull moved to authorize Trustees to place monies from the TR MMDA UCB-Construct/Renov-EdB fund in CDs for up to 3 months. The trustees are to leave \$75,000 in the liquid account. ND Harrison seconded; motion passed unanimously. Trustees are working on insurance coverage. Premiums have risen and quotes came in. Eleanor Jenkins moved to approve the Trustee's Report; Brandi Pennock seconded; motion passed unanimously.

Christian Education: Kayla Boren reported on behalf of Kacie Lipcaman. Plans are underway for the Valentine's Dinner on 2/18/2024, and a few tickets remain. 60-90 kids attend youth group each week. Renna Walters will organize the meal and volunteers. Currently, meals are funded through monetary and in-kind donations.

Music: Kayla Boren reported that the Choir is practicing for Holy Week events. Youth Band is looking at going on the Mission Trip to Artemis, KY in June with Wayne Chamberlain.

Crossroads Center: Shari Clark noted that MVCSC needs to confirm the date for the Spaghetti Dinner in April.

Building Team: Moderator Brad Losch provided a report: building team meetings have resumed on an every-other week basis. They have established that the scale/size footprint of the project remains in flux, but priorities have been identified: bathrooms, greeting area, nursery/toddler room. A chair lift may be considered in lieu of an elevator.

Mission Trip: Wayne Chamberlain gave a summary of the mission trip planned for early June to Artemis, KY, which will include youth band students. The cost will be \$250-\$300 plus transportation. The trip will be capped at 20 volunteers. He also encouraged those in attendance to support MVCSC's work as a local mission.

Pickleball Tournament. Brad Losch reported on a pickleball tournament. Our insurance agent suggested that participants sign a liability waiver.

The Motion to Adjourn was made by David Bishop and seconded by Bob Clark. The motion passed unanimously, and the meeting adjourned at 6:57PM.
