Excerpts from May 14, 2024 Church Board Meeting Minutes

Call to Order at 6:02 PM by Moderator Brad Losch. Pastor Michael Ten Eyck opened the meeting with a devotion from Titus. Minutes from the April 9, 2024 meeting were approved by general consensus.

Pastor's Report: Ministers report was attached. Spoke at the DHF conference which was also attended by Bob Clark, Hamer Tate, and Steve Tharp. Met with Black Construction about education building phases and will soon meet with the architect. Have several baptisms scheduled for the end of May.

Treasurer: Eleanor Jenkins submitted a report and presented information from the report. The total transfer to the building fund in April was \$4,435.29. Total Funds Available for Construction/Renovation \$1,680,527.21. Average YTD worship attendance through April 30: 266.

Trustees: Dan Speckhart proposed moving more funds out of Trustee MMDA to Raymond James investments. Eleanor Jenkins made a motion to transfer said funds leaving \$150,000 in Trustee MMDA. David Bishop second and the motion passed unanimously.

Christian Education: Pastor Michael reported: Children's Church will break for the summer and Sunday School teachers will also transition so everyone can refresh before fall. There will be shifts in youth Sunday School class age groups due to class sizes.

Music: Report attached. Five girls plus Kayla will join Wayne Chamberlain and Steve Tharp on a mission trip to Kentucky assisting at Still Waters Youth Ranch of Appalachia for foster children. They will leave June 1 with Kayla and girls returning June 5 and the men returning later. Kayla also submitted her letter of resignation from the music ministry position due to accepting a full-time position in the Pikeland school district. She will continue to volunteer as a worship team leader and other capacities.

Crossroads Center: Report attached. The portable basketball hoop will be donated to MVCSC due to sand harming the gym floor finish. There is potential for pickleball play to expand with consideration for storage space for nets.

Building Team: Brad Losch said there will be a building team meeting with the architect the week of May 20.

Old Business:

Rebecca and Shari Clark have worked together along with our insurance company to create an updated insurance waiver.

New Business:

Rebecca Rhodes said there had been discussion to increase the monthly contribution to DHF from \$500 to \$550. DHF provides valuable resources to FCC and other churches and there is room in the budget. Bob Clark made a motion to increase the monthly contribution to \$550. Spencer Boren second and the motion passed unanimously.

Roger Brokaw said our website link on YouVersion Bible app does not work. He also suggested giving our website a facelift. Rebecca will follow up.

Adjourn: David Bishop moved to adjourn at 6:40 pm. Brandi Pennock seconded; passed unanimously.

Closing Prayer: Brad Losch closed the meeting in prayer.
