Excerpts from January 14, 2025 Church Board Meeting Minutes

Call to order at 6 p.m. by Moderator Kathy Hull. David Bishop led the meeting in a devotion and prayer. Minutes from last meeting were approved by general consensus.

Pastor's Report: Minister's report was attached and discussed.

Treasurer: Eleanor Jenkins submitted a report and presented information from the report as of December 31, 2024. Unrestricted Operating Checking \$100,000. The total transfer to the building fund at month end was \$1,037.15. Total Funds Available for Construction/Renovation: \$1,783,921.06.

YTD Receipts: \$524,673.00. YTD Budgeted: \$542,507.00. Difference \$17,834.

YTD Disbursements: \$389,290.36. YTD Budgeted: \$542,507.00. Difference \$153,216.64.

Net Non-Budget Receipts/Disbursements: \$129,140.71.

Average 2024 worship attendance through December 31: 250

David Bishop moved to approve the Treasurer's Report and Bob Clark seconded after approving a yearly donation to be spread across 12 months rather than a lump sum. Motion passed unanimously.

Trustees: Justin Poor submitted a Trustee's Report. Roger Brokaw moved to approve and Eleanor Jenkins seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Christian Education: Niki Dixon presented a written and verbal report highlighting youth activities. Students were challenged to think about consequences, both good and bad, for their actions. Sunday School students in January will be learning about Zacchaeus.

Music: Choir practice will resume soon.

Building Team: Kathy Hull and Michael Ten Eyck reported that they will begin meeting weekly with Mike Black on Mondays at 8:30 a.m.

Old Business

The topic of the attendance policy was brought up. Church administration is researching our information and webhosting software which is now available in one package and how to implement it.

New Business:

Board members were asked to read the Policy Review and sign stating they understood.
