Excerpts from August 12, 2025 Board Minutes

Call to Order at 6:02 p.m. by Moderator Kathy Hull. Steve Tharp led the meeting in a devotion and prayer. Minutes from the July 8, 2025, meeting were approved by general consensus.

Pastor's Report: Report was attached. The building project has taken lots of time, including daily discussions with the project manager. Helped to cover responsibilities for staff during vacations. Met with 10 individuals about placing membership at FCC. Pastor Michael was appreciative for the recognition of his 20 years at FCC and noted that Rebecca Rhodes has also worked for and been a tremendous asset at FCC for 20 years.

Treasurer: Eleanor Jenkins presented information from the report as of July 31, 2025. Total General Checking \$1,664,129.28. Total Funds Available for Construction/Renovation \$1,515,902.54. YTD Receipts \$325,844.86. YTD Budgeted \$317,050.00. Difference \$8,794.86 YTD Disbursements \$247,893.38. YTD Budgeted \$318,867.00. Difference \$70,973.62. Zach Boren moved to approve the Treasurer's Report Motion passed unanimously.

Trustees: Justin Poor submitted a Trustee's Report. The following occurred after the July 31 financial statement. Withus trust distribution designated for property improvement was received. A contribution in the form of beans was received and designated towards operating usage. Bibles for youth Sunday School classes were purchased with the Vivian Cloninger memorial.

Christian Education: VBS attendance averaged 43 students and students gave over \$800 towards flood relief in Texas. Back to School bash for the Youth Group is scheduled for 8/24 from 4-8 p.m.

Music: 100th Cantata will be "He Shall Reign Forevermore!". Worship team meeting was very productive.

Building Team: An app-based door entry system will be installed; wiring is in. Mechanicals are roughed in. Installation done. Roofing done. Masonry repairs done. Utilities are scheduled to be in during the week of 8/18. Concrete in the rear and front should be started before the end of the month.

The building project committee submitted some suggestions for signage for the building. The board agreed with the design that the committee recommended. There have been some costs that exceeded estimates Ameren, brick damage repair, and concrete cracks. Fixing issues as found.

New Business: The board has been made aware of some nursing home residents who would like to attend services but are in need of transportation. One of the freezers at Crossroads is in need of repair. There will be some upcoming changes in the nursery.

Wayne Chamberlain made a motion to adjourn at 6:43p.m. and he closed the meeting in prayer.
