Excerpts from the Sept 9 Church Board Meeting

Call to order at 6:11p.m. by Moderator Kathy Hull. Bob Clark led the meeting in a devotion and prayer. Minutes from August 12, 2025, meeting were approved by general consensus.

Pastor's Report: Pastor's report was attached and discussed. Michael Ten Eyck, David Bishop and Rebecca Rhodes interviewed and recommended to the executive committee the hiring of Amy Harris as Nursery Coordinator and Jenna Hull as Crossroads Coordinator. As a result, the executive committee extended the offer to hire both. Major part of August was in the building project. Hospital visits for member's surgeries and follow-ups. DHF--Resigned from role as advisor to Decatur FCC.

Treasurer: Eleanor Jenkins presented information from the report as of August 31, 2025. The total transfer to the building fund in August was \$23,714.69. YTD Receipts \$380,659.79. YTD Budgeted \$369,895. Difference \$10,764.79. YTD Disbursements \$283,831.59. YTD Budgeted \$361,398. Difference \$77,566.41. Net Non-Budget Receipts/Disbursements \$117,133.21. Average worship attendance through August 31 = 240.

Trustees: Justin Poor submitted a Trustee's Report. Memorials were received in the name of Carolyn Long Casteel, Mary Lou Chamberlain, and Jo Rhodes.

Christian Education: Niki Dixon's report included: Kids church has started back up. Back to School Bash went well. 5th Quarter party is scheduled for September 26 at Crossroads. Hayride at Dunham farm October 26. The cost and itinerary for the Xtreme Winter Conference December 27-29 in Branson, Missouri, was explained. After discussion, a motion was made by David Bishop and seconded by Matt Saxe to let Niki make the final decision on the cost per student to attend. Motion carried.

Music: Cantata music printed and ready for choir to start.

Building Team: Highlights include: Pastor Michael continues daily meetings with Mike Black on the project needs. There has been much progress on the new building. A committee met to plan out the Long Room renovation process. Volunteers have begun the demolition phase. This is not part of the building project budget.

Old Business:

A motion was made by Jill Moss and seconded by Steve Tharp to affirm the hiring of Amy Harris as Nursery Coordinator and Jenna Hull as Crossroads Coordinator. Motion carried.

New Business:

Recommendations were given by Moderator Kathy Hull for the nominating committee and they will be contacted:

- 2 Deacons: Justin Poor and Amy Ruebush
- 2 Voting Members: John Hull and Dan Speckhart
- A motion was made by Jill Moss and seconded by Justin Poor to accept these recommendations.

A conversation ensued from the eldership regarding proposed changes to how we handle the appointment and administration of deacons. The elders will discuss this at their next meeting.

A bid from Peters Heating & Air Conditioning for HVAC yearly maintenance for the sanctuary and new building was discussed. A motion was made by Jill Moss and seconded by Eleanor Jenkins to accept this bid. Motion carried.

A bid from Peters Heating & Air Conditioning to replace the HVAC system in the Long Room was presented and discussed. David Bishop made a motion and seconded by Zach Boren to accept this bid. Motion carried.

A memorial was received from the Betty Lacy memorial.

David Bishop moved to adjourn at 7:01 p.m.; Wayne Chamberlain seconded. Motion carried.

Roger Brokaw closed the meeting in prayer.
