# Excerpts from October 12, 2025 Congregational Meeting

Call to Order: 11:45 a.m. by Moderator Kathy Hull.

Pastoral Prayer: Kathy Hull opened the meeting in prayer.

Quorum: A quorum of 19 was declared by Rebecca Rhodes, FCC Secretary.

**Minutes from Last Meeting:** The minutes from the February 2, 2025 meeting were read by Recording Secretary Linda Belford. Justin Poor made a motion which was seconded by Kevin Dyer to approve the minutes. Motion carried.

The following proposed changes were recommended:

- P 1- The date of last amendment.
- P 9-10 Remove Article VI Section 2b. Deacons, and then reorder the remaining 2 subsections (Trustee and Honored Leaders.)
- P 10 Section 3 Remove the words "or Deacon" from the section. The only elected position that a paid employee of the corporation may hold is the position of Elder, or Deacon, except for the Lead Minister
- P 10 Section 5 a. Nominating committee. Remove the reference to 2 Deacons on the nominating committee, and replace with 4 voting members of the congregation.
- P 12 Article VII section 5- Add the following text giving the Elders supervision to administer the ministries of the Deacons.: The Elders shall also appoint and oversee Deacons to serve to promote the growth, welfare and teaching of the congregation, assist in overseeing assigned areas of ministries, and help lead in the expression of a caring/sharing fellowship in time of need. They will be involved in activities and events such as serving as congregational ushers and greeters, funeral dinners, financial campaigns, visitation projects, and baptismal services, and other duties as directed by the Eldership.
- P 13 Remove Article VIII Section 6 Deacons
- P 13 Renumber Article VIII Section 6 to "Trustees"
- P 15 Article IX Add section 4 "SECTION 4. Deacons. Deacons appointed by the Elders pursuant to Section 5 of Article VII must be and remain a Voting Member of the corporation to be appointed and to continue to serve as a Deacon. Deacons will oversee particular areas of ministry as assigned and supervised by the Elders. A paid employee of the corporation may hold the position of Deacon."

We recommend implementation of these changes by the current Deacons serving out their terms under the direction of the Elders. They may be assigned to specific areas of service.

After discussion, Jack Hull made the motion to accept the proposed changes and it was seconded by Larry Wigington. Motion carried.

**Adjourn:** At 11:59a.m. a motion was made by David Bishop and seconded by Alicia Tate to adjourn. Motion carried.

Closing Prayer: Pastor Michael Ten Eyck closed the meeting in prayer.
