Excerpts from November 11, 2025 Church Board Minutes

Call to Order: 6:00 p.m. by Moderator Kathy Hull. Wayne Chamberlain led the meeting in a devotion and prayer. Minutes from the October 14, 2025, meeting were approved by general consensus.

Pastor's Report: Minister's report was attached and discussed. Highlights include: By-law Revision and Congregational Meeting prep. The Building Project continues to take up much time. Special thanks for Long Room remodel volunteers: Hamer, Steve, Sonya, David, Larry, Bob, Bob, Brad. (Hope I haven't missed anyone!) Thanks to Keith Elledge for work on the railing!!! (Caleb, Brad, Hamer for help getting it welded and loaded.) Thank you to David and the Elders for helping in visits while the building project has been so time consuming. Christmas Eve service is in the works.

Treasurer: Eleanor Jenkins submitted a report as of October 31, 2025. The total transfer to the building fund in October was \$10,394.74. YTD Receipts \$469,768.70. YTD Budgeted \$454,439. Difference \$15,329.70. YTD Disbursements \$358,961.73. YTD Budgeted \$446,310 Difference \$87,348.27. Average worship attendance through October 31 242. David Bishop moved to approve the Treasurer's Report and Steve Tharp seconded, Motion passed.

Christian Education: Highlights include: Uth@1st attended the annual Vesper Service, had prayer and worship on the square and then a bonfire and hayride at Charlotte Dunham's farm. Currently 25 students and 5 adults are registered to attend Xtreme Winter Conference in December. Six scholarships have come in. Guy's Outdoor Zone had their first activity. Hangout 45 will be visiting the Kamaroo Farms in Calhoun County. PreK-8th grade are using the Bible Walk Through lessons that Niki is creating. The changes in how the nursery is handled are working well. Many new volunteers.

Music: Gearing up for the 100th Christmas Vespers service.

Crossroads Center: Jenna Hull submitted a report and reminded members to sign up for the all-church turkey dinner on November 19.

Building Team: Pastor Michael said that there is a lot going on with the optimistic hope that it will be ready to go by Christmas.

New Business: Deep cleaning has been done in the Crossroads kitchen. CMF is planning another Outdoor Event on 11/22 at the city lake.

Elder Corner

Dear Church Family,

I came across a short story about a man named Henry Stanley. Henry Morton Stanley was born on January 28, 1841, and passed away on May 10, 1904. Stanley was a Welsh-American known as an explorer, journalist, soldier, colonial administrator, author, and politician.

During his time as a journalist, Stanley worked for the New York Herald. In November 1871 he took on the quest to find Dr. David Livingstone, a missionary who had not been heard from for five years since he started his work in Africa. Livingstone's goal was to introduce the native Africans to God and to share the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Stanley wrote in his journal, "I left the United States as an adventurer, seeker, and reporter looking for a story about a lost missionary. I was prejudiced against religion and cared little about Dr. Livingstone's work as a missionary in Africa. My only concern was he dead or alive and to bring back Livingstone's story to the New York Herald."

Dr. Livingstone was found. After spending several months with him, Stanley began to ask himself what inspired this man to be doing the work here in Africa. Dr. Livingstone was known to say, "Leave all and follow me." Little by little Stanley saw Livingstone's piety, gentleness, zeal, and ability to keep that life style each and every day. Stanley's view of Christianity changed from a cynical one to observing the hope and trust that can be found in following Christ.

Stanley returned to the United States, never to talk with Dr. Livingstone again. After some time he heard of Livingstone's death. Stanley remarked that he was determined to follow Livingstone's footsteps for he had met a man that changed his view of Christianity for the rest of his life.

At this Thanksgiving season, let's give thanks to God for individuals who have made an impact on our walk with God and live our life in a real life-giving relationship with God.
