## Excerpts from December 9, 2025 Board Meeting

**Call to order at 6 p.m.** by Moderator Kathy Hull. Pastor Michael Ten Eyck led the meeting in a devotion and prayer. Minutes from the November 11, 2025, meeting were approved by general consensus.

**Pastor's Report:** Minister's report was attached and discussed. Highlights include: The Building Project continues to move forward but takes lots of time and volunteers. Special shout out to Larry Wigington for installing the new pocket doors and Sonya Bishop for repairing the stained glass windows. And we appreciate Hamer Tate, Steve Tharp and Bob Clark who continue to work on a regular basis. Pastoral connections with families impacted by recent deaths. Thanks to Jenna Hull in her first year being responsible for the Thanksgiving dinner.

**Treasurer:** Eleanor Jenkins presented information from the report as of November 30, 2025: Unrestricted Operating Checking: \$ 100,000. The total transfer to the building fund in November was \$6,667.77. Total Funds Available for Construction/Renovation \$1,155,169.52. YTD Receipts \$512,466.59. YTD Budgeted \$507,283. Difference \$5,183.59. YTD Disbursements \$393,148.95. YTD Budgeted \$488,841. Difference \$95,692.05. Average worship attendance through November 30 = 243. David Bishop moved to approve the Treasurer's Report and Justin Poor seconded. Motion carried.

**Christian Education:** Report was attached. Niki submitted a grant application to DOT Foods which was awarded in the amount of \$500 to help pay for costs of the Branson trip for Uth@1st. Hangout 45 enjoyed their trip to Kamaroo Farms and had lots of questions. Working with students, teachers and families to resolve some behavior issues during Sunday school and Children's church.

**Music:** Cantata is in crunch time.

**Crossroads Center:** Jenna Hull submitted a calendar and reported that it's very busy.

**Building Team:** Pastor Michael explained that the brick for the front has finally arrived but because of the cold weather, it will probably be spring before it can be completed. Plumbers and electricians are finished and the Long Room is nearly done. Be cautious around the new building especially until the snow guards can be installed on the roof.

### Old Business:

The following three motions were made by the Elders:

1. Donate \$5,000 to DHF using funds from Evangelism. Motion carried.
2. Currently any amount over \$100,000 in the Operating line item of the checking account goes into the Building Fund. Discontinue that automatic rollover into the Building Fund. Motion carried.
3. Rollover any excess over \$100,000 in the Operating line item of the checking into a line item to be named Extra Ministries and will be used at the discretion of the elders. Motion carried.

The carpet in the balcony needs to be replaced.

Pew cushions should arrive soon.

### New Business:

Staff end of year bonuses were discussed and the amounts will be finalized by the board via email in the next few days.

**Adjourn:** David Bishop moved to adjourn at 6:46 p.m. Eleanor Jenkins seconded and all approved.

**Closing Prayer:** Zach Boren closed the meeting in prayer.

Dear Church Family,

During Advent, we have been looking at some of our most beloved Christmas songs and their timeless message. Even thinking about Christmas songs has a way of stirring our hopes. We imagine Christmas lights, those familiar melodies, meaningful gatherings, and a sense that everything will be just right by Christmas. We plan carefully, and look with expectation to the perfect Christmas. And yet, as many of us know from experience, plans do not always unfold the way we imagine.

The Christmas story itself reminds us of that truth. Mary and Joseph certainly did not plan to welcome their first child far from home, surrounded by animals, with no room available. They did not expect a manger to become a cradle or questionable shepherds to be their first visitors. The long-awaited Messiah arrived not with comfort and certainty, but with interruption, inconvenience, and surprise. And still, God was powerfully at work. What looked like a detour was actually the fulfillment of His promise. Emmanuel had come. God was, and is, with us!

In many ways, our church family can relate this season. The building project has not gone entirely as planned. We had hoped it would be fully completed by Christmas, ready to welcome this season with everything finished and functioning. Instead, unexpected delays have slowed progress and shifted timelines. Hopes have been deferred a bit. Plans adjusted and spaces rethought. I have had to fight a bit of disappointment mixed in with anticipation.

Yet, in spite of this, Advent invites us to pause and remember what truly matters. Christmas has never been about perfect circumstances or finished projects. It has always been about God stepping into imperfect places with His perfect love and abiding peace. The light of the world did not wait for everything to be ready. He came into the mess, the waiting, and the uncertainty.

So this Christmas, we choose to focus our hearts where they belong. We rejoice that God's love has come down to us in Jesus. We celebrate Emmanuel, God with us, in every season and situation. We give thanks that even when our plans change, His promises and His peace never do.

I hope you will join me in celebrating Christ's birth in our two upcoming special services. The Vesper Choir will present the **100th Christmas Vespers** on **Sunday, December 21 at 5:00 pm**, and on **Christmas Eve, December 24 at 9:00 pm**, join us for our **Candlelight Service**, as we lift our voices, light our candles, and proclaim the Christmas story of good news of great joy.

This Christmas, finished or unfinished, planned or unexpected, may our hearts prepare Him room. God is with us... and that is more than enough.
