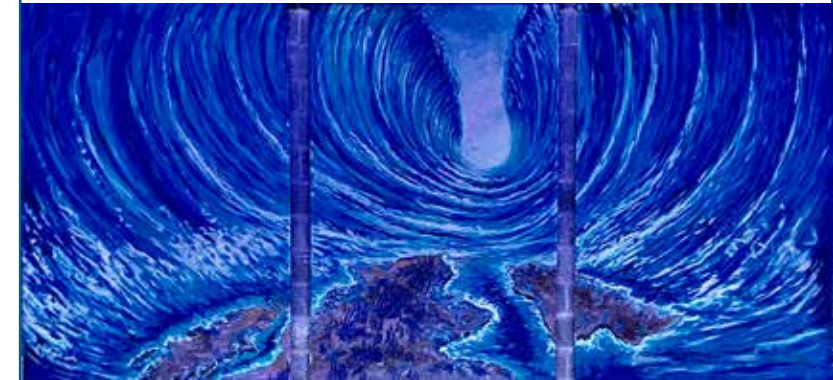

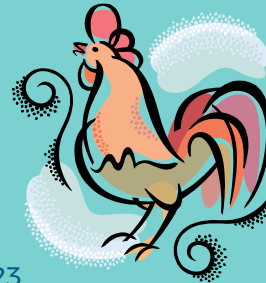

HOME GROUP QUESTIONS

Week 3 | 1.26.25
The Book of Exodus

Scripture:
Exodus 17:1-7

Group Gathering Question:

In Exodus 16 and 17, we see the people complain to Moses. What do you complain most about: work, traffic, weather, family, or something else?

Read this week's Scripture and discuss these questions.

1. The people quarrel with Moses (complain to Moses) because there is no water to drink. Do you think they have a valid complaint? Could they have handled the issue differently with Moses?
2. In verses 2-4, the people are so unhappy that Moses thinks they might want to stone him. Was the lack of water the only problem? Or is there a deeper issue or lesson here for the people?
3. Do you think there was already water in the rock that Moses struck or that the water was already in the rock and God simply needed to direct Moses where to strike? Why? Does it make any difference in how we interpret this passage?
4. In verse 4, Moses cries out to the Lord "What am I to do with these people (instead of the more endearing "my people")? How do you think Moses is feeling about the Israelites and where does he go for help? What do you do and how do you seek help or advice when people complain to you and ask you to solve problems?
5. Moses is often stuck between God and God's people. In what ways in your life have you/are you trying to hold together two things/parties and what toll has that taken on you?
6. What might this passage teach us about the authority of Moses and the authority of God? What might we learn from this story about stress, trust, and obedience? How might you give your frustrations to God in a healthy way?
