Week 7 | 5.18.25 Exodus Scripture: Deuteronomy 32:44-52; 34:1-12

Group Gathering Question:


There are many famous Bible stories about Moses and the exodus from Egypt. From this sermon series or previous studies, do you have a favorite story about Moses or a favorite thing you have learned?

Read this week's scripture and discuss these questions.

- 1. In Deuteronomy 32:47, Moses says, "They are not idle words for you, they are your life." Read Moses' words around it to get some context. What does this very strong statement mean? Why are his words "your life?"
- 2. Why will Moses only see the Promised Land from a distance, atop Mount Nebo across from Jericho? Does this seem harsh to you that he can't go on with the Israelites? What might be the messages for the people in saying goodbye to Moses and now following Joshua?
- 3. Read what Deuteronomy says about Moses in 34:10-12. What would you like for people to say about you after you pass? What might you do now for people to say good things later?
- 4. What about Moses's relationship with God and his people made him unique? What about those relationships could be common to other believers like us?
- 5. Earlier in his life, Moses had killed an Egyptian man and said that he was too "slow of speech" to be God's spokesman to Pharaoh. Now, we read in Deuteronomy 34 that Moses knew God face to face, did miraculous signs and wonders, and that no prophet in Israel was like him. In thinking about Moses, what made him great? What life lessons can we learn from Moses to use in our own day?
- 6. Does it bring you peace or anxiety to know that you will not be able to finish everything you would like before your death?
