A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Good Shepherd family,

This coming April 21st is a very special day for me for a number of reasons. First, it will be our son James' 10th birthday. As many of you know, he was born on Easter Monday of 2014 and has been a wonderful part of our life as a family ever since. April 21st this year is also the 4th Sunday of Easter, which is always designated as "Good Shepherd Sunday."

Those of you who have been part of this congregation since April of 2021 will remember that Good Shepherd Sunday of 2021 was the date we chose to resume in-person worship after more than a year of worshipping together in the parking lot during the height of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Just as the Good Shepherd congregation and its members are near and dear to me, I now hold a special place in my heart for Good Shepherd Sunday because of the trials we endured together and because of the way God made for us to worship together after such a difficult year. Now, this Sunday is a reminder to me each year that Christ is indeed with us as our Good Shepherd. If it seems the wolves of this world are ready to snatch us away and devour us, we need only remember Jesus' words of comfort and promise from John 10:

I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep.

We have this blessed assurance from our Lord that nothing in all creation can separate us from his love for us. As we gather this month in worship, especially on the 21st, let's give thanks that we can gather safely as one. Let's give thanks that God has brought us out of a time of fear and crisis. Let's give thanks for our Good Shepherd congregational family. And most of all, let's give thanks for Jesus, who is truly the Good Shepherd.

SOCIAL MINISTRY MONTHLY EMPHASIS

Last year when the mission team visited the South Western Diocese, we learned that their crops had changed, and this was presenting a major issue in their farming practices. Tanzania had previously imported their wheat from the Ukraine. With the war and the restrictions on Ukrainian exports, wheat was no longer available to the people of Tanzania. Unable to find another equitable source to import from, the Tanzanian government mandated that the farmers had to grow their own wheat.

The ladies have planted the wheat, but the harvesting by hand has presented a real problem. It is a real tedious and cumbersome job. In fact, they needed to hire paid help which took away food and any profits that were made for their family.

The ladies requested small tractor attachments that they could hook to borrowed motorcycles. This is not a good solution, and it is impractical to buy these machines for all the ladies.

There was a discussion between our team and the diocesan leadership. It was thought that we could design a co-op program where the village ladies would share the equipment. A small house would be built (She Shed) to store and maintain the equipment. There would be a manager for the equipment. We are hoping to raise enough money to buy a tractor and planting and threshing attachments.

Please consider helping these overcome their obstacles with farming. Your contribution can help sustain them and their families. Please see the display in the Narthex.


FOOD PANTRY UPDATE

The GSLC Food Pantry provided food to 38 families in February serving 146 individuals.

























LECTIONARY FOR APRIL 2024

<u> APRIL 7 – SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER</u>

The Easter season is a week of weeks, seven Sundays when we play in the mystery of Christ's presence, mostly through the glorious Gospel of John. Today we gather with the disciples on the first Easter, and Jesus breathes the Spirit on us. With Thomas we ask for a sign, and Jesus offers us his wounded self in the broken bread. From frightened individuals we are transformed into a community of open doors, peace, forgiveness, and material sharing such that no one among us is in need. *FIRST READING – Act 4:32-35*

While the apostles testified to others about the resurrection of Jesus, the early Christian community shared what they owned or sold their possessions to help

their fellow believers who were in need. **PSALM – Psalm 133**

How good and pleasant it is to live together in unity. (Ps. 133:1)

SECOND READING - 1 John 1:1-2:2

The opening of this letter serves as a reality check. The reality of God is light, but our confessed reality has been sin. God cleanses us from our sinful reality through Christ's death so that we live in fellowship with Christ and walk in God's light.

GOSPEL - John 20:19-31

The story of Easter continues as the risen Jesus appears to his disciples. His words to Thomas offer a blessing to all who entrust themselves in faith to the risen Lord.

<u> APRIL 14 – THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER</u>

The gospel for the third Sunday of Easter is always one in which the risen Christ shares food with the disciples, meals that are the Easter template for the meal we share each Sunday. In today's gospel, Jesus both shares the disciples' food and shows them the meaning of his suffering, death, and resurrection through the scriptures, the two main elements of our Sunday worship.

FIRST READING – Act 3:12-19

After healing a man unable to walk, Peter preaches to the people, describing how God's promises to Israel have been fulfilled in Jesus. Through the proclamation of Christ's death and resurrection, God is offering them forgiveness and restoration in Jesus' name.

PSALM – Psalm 4

The LORD does wonders for the faithful. (Ps. 4:3) **SECOND READING – 1 John 3:1-7**

God has loved us in order to make us children of God. Though we do not yet know the full details of our future existence, we trust that God will reveal it just as God revealed Jesus to take away our sins.

GOSPEL - Luke 24:36b-48

In this account of an appearance after his resurrection, Jesus opens the minds of the disciples to understand him as Messiah. Jesus convinces them that he has been raised and sends them on a mission to proclaim the message of repentance and forgiveness.

<u> APRIL 21 – FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER</u>

The image of the good shepherd shows us how the risen Christ brings us to life. It is the relationship between the shepherd and the sheep, one of mutual knowledge and love, that gives the shepherd authority. The shepherd's willingness to lay down his life for the sheep shows his love. First John illustrates what it means to lay down our lives for one another by the example of sharing our wealth with any sibling in need.

FIRST READING – Acts 4:5-12

Peter and John had been arrested the previous day because they were proclaiming the news of the resurrection to the people. In today's reading, Peter is filled with the Holy Spirit so that he can proclaim salvation in Jesus' name to the religious authorities.

PSALM – Psalm 23

The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not be in want. (Ps. 23:1) SECOND READING – 1 John 3:16-24

Jesus' death on our behalf is the clearest demonstration of divine love. This is the very love we share with others, not just through our words but especially through our deeds. In sharing such love we fulfill God's commandments.

GOSPEL – John 10:11-18

In language that recalls the twenty-third psalm, Jesus describes himself as the shepherd who cares for his sheep. He is willing to die for them, and he is able to overcome death for them.

APRIL 28 – FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

This Sunday's image of how the risen Christ shares his life with us is the image of the vine. Christ the vine and we the branches are alive in each other, in the mystery of mutual abiding described in the gospel and the first letter of John. Baptism makes us a part of Christ's living and life-giving self and makes us alive with Christ's life. As the vine brings food to the branches, Christ feeds us at his table. We are sent out to bear fruit for the life of the world.

FIRST READING – Acts 8:26-40

Led by the Spirit, Philip encounters an Ethiopian official who is returning to his African home after having been to Jerusalem to worship. Philip uses their encounter to proclaim the gospel to him. Upon coming to faith in Jesus, he is baptized by Philip.

PSALM – Psalm 22:25-31

All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the LORD. (Ps. 22:27)

SECOND READING - 1 John 4:7-21

We love God and others because God first loved us. We cannot say we love God, whom we have not seen, while hating fellow Christians, whom we regularly see. Love toward God is to be matched by love toward others because the essence of God is love.

GOSPEL – John 15:1-8

On the night of his arrest, Jesus taught his disciples about the relationship they would have with him. Those who abide in his word and love bear fruit, for apart from him, they can do nothing.


