Confession of Sin Based on Hebrews 12:3-11 (NIV)

Lord, we come confessing. We grow weary and fainthearted because we do not consider Christ who endured hostility against himself.

In our struggle against sin, we have not resisted to the point of shedding our blood.

We too often forget the exhortation that addresses us as your children.

We try to excuse, escape or disregard your discipline and grow weary when you reprove us.

*Yet you discipline the ones you love,
and chastise every son and daughter you receive.*

**Give us grace to endure under discipline
knowing that you are treating us as your children.**

We know that if we are left without discipline, than we are not true children of God. For you discipline us for our good, that we may share in your holiness. For the moment all discipline seems painful rather than pleasant.

But remind us that discipline later yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it.





If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. 1 John 1:9




