### **Biographies**

Robin Leigh Massie, soprano, and Steven Condy, baritone, were married in 1992 after receiving their master's degrees from Yale University. They have established themselves with careers in concert, opera and Musical Theater that span the globe.

Robin Leigh Massie, established herself as a versatile artist in opera, concert and musical theatre. She made her New York City Opera debut as Flora in Benjamin Britten's *The Turn of The Screw*. She has also performed with the Tulsa, Kentucky, Glimmerglass and Princeton Opera companies. In musical theatre, she performed the role of Jellylorum in Andrew Lloyd Weber's *CATS* in Hamburg, Germany. She has also sung with the Bucks County, Pocono and Gateway Playhouses and toured South America singing the role of Christine in Ivan Jacobs' *The Phantom of the Opera*.

In concert repertoire, Robin performed annually with the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra for 19 consecutive seasons in *Yuletide Celebration*. She has performed with the Utah Symphony Orchestra in Leonard Bernstein's *Mass* for the farewell concert of Maestro Keith Lockhart, the MasterWorks Festival Orchestra in Mahler's Fourth Symphony, and with The South Dakota Symphony Orchestra in Handel's <u>Messiah</u>. Other performances include the Susquehanna Valley Chorale, The Bucks County Choral Society and Mendelssohn's *A Midsummer Night's Dream* with The New York City Ballet. She is also featured as the soprano soloist in Mozart's *Laudate Dominum* on the 1996 Chesky Records recording <u>Like As a Hart</u> with Joseph Flummerfelt and the Westminster Choir.

A native of Austin, Texas, Robin has a Bachelor of Music degree in Voice Performance from Westminster Choir College and a Master of Music Degree in Voice/Opera Performance from Yale University. She also serves on the voice faculties of both Cairn University and Westminster Choir College of Rider University.

Steven Condy has enjoyed a career filled with notoriety and acclaim for his creative portrayals of the great "buffo" roles and is admired not only for his robust and nuanced voice, but also for his natural acting ability. Most recently, he performed the title role in Verdi's Falstaff with Knoxville Opera, Scarpia in Tosca with Opera Carolina and Major General Stanley in The Pirates of Penzance with Opera Grand Rapids. Renowned for his interpretation of Dr. Bartolo in Il barbiere di Siviglia, with over 100 performances, the Boston Music Intelligencer raved of his "most delightfully surprising and truly brilliant performance...the agility of his voice, not only in negotiating the vocal roller-coasters, but also in creating comically nuanced coloring..." He was on the esteemed roster of The Metropolitan Opera and has performed with companies throughout North America, including San Francisco, Dallas, Los Angeles, Calgary, Boston, Houston and many more.

Steven holds a Bachelor of Music degree in music education from the University of Hartford and a Master of Music degree in voice/opera performance from Yale University. He serves as the Music Recruitment and Events Coordinator at Cairn University, where he is also a member of the voice faculty.

Jamie Rankin (piano) studied music and German at Wheaton College and has been working with Christian youth choirs in Germany since 1980 as arranger and conductor. He received his Ph.D. in Germanic literature from Harvard University, and now teaches as a Senior Lecturer in German at and the Director of the Princeton Center for Language Study at Princeton University, where he is also involved in the campus ministry of Princeton Christian Fellowship.
