


Soul Garden: Pruning for Life

I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit He prunes so that it will be even more fruitful.

John 15:1-2 NIV

I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in Me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from Me you can do nothing.

John 15:5 NIV

John 15:9 NIV

Discipline is NOT:

1. All troubles
2. Always quick , immediate , punitive

Four results of discipline:

1. Fruitfulness
2. Holiness
3. Righteousness
4. Peace

How we respond:

1. Reflect and ask: "Is this in any way connected to sin in me?"
2. Do long range reflection
3. Remain in His love
