<p><b>Read</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Hebrews 7:11-28</li> </ul> <p><b>Discuss</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>After reading this passage, what observations can you make?</li> <li>What stuck out to you the most, and why?</li> </ul>	<p><b>Reflect</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This passage, along with 1 Tim 2:5, are the reasons why we, as Evangelicals, don’t believe that we need to go to a priest for intercession and forgiveness. We can go directly to the Father, through Jesus.</li> <li>Yet, we are also told in James 5:16 to “confess our sins” to one other. Why should we do this?</li> <li>Our Small Group, or finding a member from the Small Group, can be a great avenue to practice James 5:16. Is this something this group is open to doing?</li> <li>Prayerfully consider how we can move in this direction.</li> </ul> <p><b>Memorize:</b> Hebrews 7:25</p>
