(As we should! “He has risen indeed!”) But what is surprising about the message he gives to Mary in this passage? Why is Jesus’ ascension just as important as His resurrection? Should this change the focus of our celebration at all?

<p>Read</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Hebrews 10:1-18 <p>Discuss</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> What are the benefits believers receive from Christ’s sacrifice listed in this passage? In what way are these greater than the Old Testament system? 	<p>Reflection</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Do you struggle with the idea that Christ has made you “perfect” (acceptable to God), or “remembers your sins no more” (does not count them against you)? Why or why not? “For by a single offering, he has perfected for all time those who are <i>being sanctified</i>.” (Hebrews 10:14) In what ways do you see Jesus “sanctifying” you? (How is He making you more like Him?) If you are willing to share, in what ways do you <i>still need Him</i> to help you become more like Him? <p>Memorize: Hebrews 10:12-13</p>
