(2) Read Scripture	(4) Application
 Read Luke 4:14-30 Discuss Jesus was rejected as a "prophet in his hometown" in part because the people who knew Him as a child struggled to believe He was who He claimed to be. Have you ever experienced rejection from friends or family for following Jesus? How does it encourage you to know that Jesus experienced rejection too? 	 Application Pastor Dave told the story about John Newton and his conversion to Christianity after being saved from a storm during his time as a slave ship captain. At the core of his conversion, what was John Newton's realization? (consider the words of Amazing Grace). Was there a moment in your life when you had a similar revelation? If so, what led to that realization for you? John's conversion led him to fight for the dismantling of slave trade in England. Are we called to fight against injustice in our society today because of our faith in Jesus? If so, how? Memorize: Luke 4:18-19
