<p>Read</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Luke 7:11-17 <p>Discuss</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Many people say they want unlimited power because of the good they would do with it. But what do we know about what unlimited power does to people? • Jesus is shown to have unlimited power in this passage. • Why are His actions so shocking for someone with that kind of power? • Why are His actions so encouraging? • How was your situation like the widow’s before Jesus showed up in your life? 	<p>Application</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This week was an actual “test” of what we would do with “power”. Some had it. Others didn’t. • What was your situation through the storm? • If you were in need, did you ask for help? Why or why not? • If you had power, did you offer to share what you had? Why or why not? • Even though many of us shared what we had, there is usually a point where we would choose the comfort and safety of our family over others. Why does this make Jesus’ willingness to sacrifice His own comfort and safety for us so much more amazing? • How can we challenge each other to be more like Jesus? <p>Memorize: Philippians 2:3-4</p>
