<ul> <li>Prayer Requests</li> <li>Leader: Take prayer requests and spend time as a group in prayer, either at the beginning or ending of the meeting.</li> <li>Scripture Memory</li> <li>Can anyone recite Galatians 5:1 or any other verses that we have memorized this semester? Continue to challenge each other to memorize God's Word.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>In the Garden of Eden: it was possible to sin and it was possible not to sin</li> <li>After Genesis 3: it was only possible to sin, and impossible not to sin</li> <li>After the cross: it is possible to sin and it is possible not to sin</li> <li>In the New Heavens &amp; Earth: it will be impossible to sin! (i.e. True Freedom!)</li> <li>Discuss</li> <li>Often times, Christians say that they wish we could go back to the Garden of Eden. Why should we long for the New Heavens and New Earth instead?</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>Galatians 5:16-26</li> <li>Discuss</li> <li>How were you taught to avoid sin in your Christian upbringing? (i.e. were you told "not" do certain things, or were you encouraged to "walk by the Spirit?")</li> <li>Was the demonstration of walking in two directions helpful in understanding why we can't sin while walking by the Spirit?</li> <li>Were there any works of the flesh that Paul lists that surprised you? Why or why not?</li> <li>Why do you think works of the flesh are called "works" while the fruit of the Spirit is called "fruit"?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Application</li> <li>If you are willing to share, what "works of the flesh" have been the biggest struggle for you in your Christian life?</li> <li>In what ways have you tried to deal with those sins in the past?</li> <li>What would "walking by the Spirit" look like in that situation? (Remember: you can't sin in that way if you are "walking" in the opposite direction)</li> <li>How can this group hold you accountable to doing that?</li> <li>Memorize</li> <li>Galatians 5:16</li> </ul>
