JAMES: HUMILITY & HOPE

James 4

1.	Wrestle with the questions presented in James 4:1. In what ways do the values of our politics, culture, media, and the broad religious or theological landscape play into how you answer these important questions? Despite your best intentions, how does your behavior impact those around you?
