

James 5:1–12

1. Read James 5:1–6. In what ways do you see financial injustice perpetrated against your neighbors? How does this reality inform your own perspective on wealth and how you steward your resources?

2. In James 5:1–12 are several references either direct or oblique to the return of Jesus in latter days—particularly with judgment in mind. Where do you see those references within the passage? How does Jesus' pending return influence your own relationship with Jesus?

3. In what way does Jesus' pending return intensify your effort to share the gospel with those around you? Why or why not?

The picture offered to us in James 5:7–12 is of the need to bear injustice patiently and with the Lord's compassion and mercy.
