DISCUSSION GUIDE December 10, 2023

WEARY WORLD, REJOICE: FEAR

Isaiah 8:22

1.	Read Isaiah 8:17–22. In what ways are the dark and troubling times of Isaiah's day seen today? Then, in light of such, how can the prophecy of Isaiah 9:1–7 inform us?
2.	The prophecy presented in Isaiah 9:1 tells us there need be no more gloom for both ancient Israel (Zebulun and Naphtali) and the "land beyond the nations (Gentiles)." What does this say about God's love for the nations? How does this motivate our own care for people from different cultures, ethnicities and nations?
3.	How might the words of Isaiah 9:2 & 6 help you share the good news (gospel) with someone else during this Christmas season? See John 3:16–18 for further insight.
4.	Isaiah 9:4 tells us the Lord breaks burdens for those oppressed and weighed down. Knowing such is the heart of the Lord, what are practical ways you can come alongside another to alleviate her or his burdens?
