DISCUSSION GUIDE December 17, 2023

WEARY WORLD, REJOICE: HOPE Luke 2:11

1	. We live in a messy world, yet we are hungry for the transcendent. How do we navigate that tension? In what ways do we put our hope in the wrong things?
2	. How can we take the message of the angel (Luke 2:11) to give hope to those around us through our words, actions and posture?
3	. Read Luke 2:10. The angel was clear the "good news" was for "all the people." Why does this matter to the heart of God? See Romans 15:12 and Revelation 5:6–14 for further insight.
4	. See Luke 2:17. Upon hearing the good news, the first thing the shepherds did was act on the angel's words, believe what they heard and saw and share it widely. How can you follow their example during this Christmas season?
